Terrestrial vegetation refers to the plant communities that occur across the landscapes in the planning area. Terrestrial vegetation plays an important role in ecosystem diversity, habitat, and human values.



Vegetation Communities

Native Plants

Vegetation communities occur across the landscape and can be assessed with a coarse filter analysis. A wide diversity of communities occur in the planning area.

Native plants are components of vegetation communities. Certain plants of conservation concern or public interest may be assessed with a fine filter analysis.
