



Firewood Cutting on the Clackamas River Ranger District is authorized as each column describes. All open spur roads associated with the main road number have the same designation. Roads listed under Column 3 have specific firewood cutting area restrictions on the following pages of this table. Cutting restrictions are based on Late Successional Reserve (LSR) location, active timber sale areas, non-forest service land ownership, Wilderness, and others as described.

Firewood cutting restrictions for roads listed in Column 3.

If you choose to collect firewood on the following roads, you must know where you are, and follow the special restrictions listed for that road. Cutting firewood in unauthorized areas or on Non-Forest Service Land is prohibited. You must also follow the conditions of your permit and the rules and regulations on the Weekly Information Sheet.

Road Number	Restrictions
42	From the 46 road junction, wood cutting is allowed within the road prism only for the first 4 miles (to approximately the 4220 junction). From there, wood cutting is allowed within the road prism and within 100 feet of both sides of the road for the next 15 miles. No wood cutting past this point (approximately 1.2 miles from the 57 road junction is the start of non-FS land).
4220	Wood cutting is allowed within the road prism and within 100 feet of the road from the 42 junction to approximately 0.7 miles north of the 4690 junction. From that point to the Olallie Scenic Area boundary, wood cutting is only allowed within the road prism. An approved Special Request is required to gather firewood within the Olallie Scenic Area.
4240	Wood cutting is allowed within the road prism and within 100 feet of both sides of the road for 2 miles from the 42 road junction. No wood cutting beyond this point (non-FS land).
4245	Wood cutting is allowed within the road prism and within 100 feet of both sides of the road for 1.8 miles from the 42 road junction (to 220 spur). No wood cutting beyond this point (non-FS land).
4250	No wood cutting – Timber Sale Activity
4260	No wood cutting – Timber Sale Activity
45	Firewood Cutting allowed by Special Request only because of checkerboard land ownership and Late Successional Reserve boundaries.
4510	From Hillockburn northern junction: Road prism only from 45 junction 2.3 miles to the 130 spur road. No wood cutting for the next 2.7 miles (non-FS land). The next 1.3 miles (within T5S, R4E Sec. 23) firewood cutting is allowed within the road prism and within 100 feet of the road. No wood cutting for the next 1.3 miles (non-FS land). For the remainder of the road (0.4 miles) to the southern junction of the 45 road, firewood cutting is allowed within the road prism and within 100 feet of both sides of the road.
4520	No wood cutting for the first 0.2 miles from the 45 road (non-FS land). From there, wood cutting is only allowed within the road prism for only the next 0.6 miles. From there, no wood cutting is allowed (non-FS land) for the next 0.6 miles (this includes the 011 and 012 spur roads). For the next 0.2 miles to the 4510 road junction wood cutting is allowed within the road prism and within 100 feet of both sides of the road (this includes the 120 spur road).
4530	Wood cutting is only allowed within 100 feet of the east side of the road, where the road is within Township 5 South, Range 4 East, Section 25 (T5S, R4E, and Sec.25). You can also measure this distance on your vehicle trip meter from the 45 road junction as 0.8 miles to 1.2 miles. No wood cutting is allowed along all other sections of this road and its spurs due to non-Forest Service land.
4531	No wood cutting along this road (non-FS land).
4545	From the West Junction (Hillockburn side): Wood cutting within road prism and 100' of the road for the first 0.3 miles. No wood cutting for approximately the next 1 mile (non-FS land). Continue road prism and within 100' of both sides of the road for the remainder of the road to the East Junction of the 45 road. Wood cutting is allowed within the road prism only of the 130 spur road.
4550	Wood cutting is allowed within road prism and within both sides of the road for the first 1 mile from the 45 road junction. For the next ¼ mile, wood cutting is allowed only within the road prism. Beyond that point, wood cutting resumes within the road prism, and within 100 feet of both sides of the road.



4610	No wood cutting is allowed between HWY 224 and the end of the pavement (BLM land). The 4610 road is open for wood cutting within the Road Prism and within 100 feet of the edge of the road up to the 170 spur. East of the 170 spur road, wood cutting is only allowed within the 4610 road prism. Wood cutting is allowed on the decked wood located at the new OHV Staging area site. CAUTION: There is an Active BLM timber sale near the 4610113 Spur (OHV Trail 802) and they are hauling down the 4610 to HWY 224. It is recommended to access the LaDee Flat area from the Tumala Road, and 4613 road to avoid log truck traffic.
4614	Once you are on Mt. Hood National Forest land, wood cutting is allowed within the road prism and within 100 feet of both sides of the road for 6 miles. Beyond that point, wood cutting is only allowed within the road prism. <i>If you are travelling on Tumala Mountain Road (Squaw Mtn. Road) from HWY 224 you will need to drive approximately 10 miles before you come to National Forest Land. Clear-cut areas and blue gates are not on Mt. Hood National Forest land. Your permit is only valid on Mt. Hood National Forest land.</i>
4615	Wood cutting is allowed within the road prism and 100 feet of both sides of the road for the first 0.3 miles. No wood cutting is allowed for the next 0.3 miles (non-FS land). Continue within road prism and 100' of the road for the remainder of the 4615 road. <i>If you are travelling on Tumala Mountain Road from HWY 224 you will need to drive approximately 10 miles before you come to National Forest Land. Clear-cut areas and blue or yellow gates are not on Mt. Hood National Forest land. Your permit is only valid on Mt. Hood National Forest land.</i>
4620	Wood cutting is allowed within the road prism only. Wood cutting is allowed on log decks and slash piles on this road as long as they are located on the road shoulder or ditch.
4621	Wood cutting is allowed within the road prism only. Wood cutting is allowed on log decks and slash piles on this road as long as those piles/decks are located on the road shoulder or ditch.
4630	Wood cutting is allowed within road prism and 100' of the road for the first 1.5 miles (from the 224 junction). Continue road prism only for 0.4 miles (Non-FS land). Continue woodcutting within road prism and 100' of the road for the remainder of the road. On the 200 Spur: Wood cutting within the road prism only the first 1.7 miles traveling from the HWY 224 junction.
4635	Wood cutting is allowed within road prism and within 100 feet of both sides of the road for the first 7 miles to the 017 spur road junction. Beyond that point wood cutting is only allowed within the road prism.
4640	Wood cutting is allowed within the road prism and 100 feet of the east side of the road only for the first ¼ mile (to the 120 spur) from the 46 road junction. After that, wood cutting is allowed within 100 feet of both sides of the road to the 157 spur (approximately 3.3 miles from the 46 road). From the 157 spur to the 173 spur (approximately 5.6 miles from 46 junction) wood cutting is only allowed within road prism and 100 feet of the north side of the road. From the 173 spur to the end, wood cutting is only allowed within the road prism. Wood cutting on the 120 spur is within road prism and 100 feet of east side of the road only. Wood cutting on 157 spur is within road prism and 100 of north side of the road only.
4645	Wood cutting is allowed within road prism only for the first 0.4 miles to the 120 spur. Continue within road prism and 100' of the east side of the road for the next 0.3 miles to the 012 spur. For approximately 0.4 miles wood cutting is allowed within road prism and 100 feet of both sides of the road to the end of the road. The road is decommissioned at approximately 1.1 miles from the 46 road.
4651	Wood cutting is only allowed within the road prism and within 100' of the West side of the road for the length of the road.
4671	Wood cutting is allowed within the road prism and within 100 feet of the west side of the road for the first 2 miles to the 160 spur road junction. Beyond that point, wood cutting is allowed within the road prism and within 100 feet of both sides of the road. Wood cutting is allowed on log decks and slash piles on this road.
4680	Wood cutting is allowed within the road prism only. Wood cutting is allowed on log decks and slash piles on this road.



4690	Wood cutting is allowed within the road prism only for the first 6.4 miles from the 46 road junction. Then, wood cutting is allowed for the next 0.7 miles within the road prism and within 100 feet of the road. After that, wood cutting is only allowed within road prism 7 miles from the 46 road junction to the 4220 junction.
5410	Wood cutting is allowed on the slash piles and small decks along the side of the road, and along spur roads. These small decks and slash piles were left and are available as firewood after the timber sale was completed. Please do not pull wood from the center of the slash piles. All other woodcutting along the 5410 and its spur roads is allowed within road prism only.
5411	Wood cutting is allowed on the slash piles and small decks along the side of the road, and along spur roads. These small decks and slash piles were left and are available as firewood after the timber sale was completed. Please do not pull wood from the center of the slash piles. All other wood cutting along the 5411 and its spur roads is allowed within the road prism and up to 100 feet from the edge of the road.
5412	Wood cutting is allowed on the slash piles and small decks along the side of the road, and along spur roads. These small decks and slash piles were left and are available as firewood after the timber sale was completed. Please do not pull wood from the center of the slash piles. All other wood cutting along the 5412 and its spur roads is allowed within the road prism and up to 100 feet from the edge of the road.
5710	Wood cutting is allowed within the road prism and within 100 feet of both sides of the road up to 1 mile from the 5720. For the last 1 mile to the 5720 road, wood cutting is only allowed within the road prism and within 100 feet of the north side of the road.
5720	For the first 4.3 miles from the 57 road junction wood cutting is allowed within the road prism and within 100 feet of both sides of the road. For the next 0.7 miles wood cutting is only allowed within the road prism and within 100 feet of the east side of the road (to the 180 spur road junction). Beyond that point, wood cutting resumes within road prism and within 100 feet of both sides of the road to the 5731 junction. Wood cutting on the 180 spur is allowed within the road prism and within 100 feet of the east side of the road for the first ½ mile, after than it is open within road prism and 100 of both sides of the road.
58	Wood cutting is allowed within road prism and both sides of the road for the first 4 miles (from junction with Road 57). Continue road prism only for the next 6.7 miles. For the next 8 miles, wood cutting is allowed within the road prism and within 100 feet of both sides of the road. There is no wood cutting allowed along the last 1 mile to the 42 road (non-FS land).
5820	Traveling from the west end junction with the 5810 - Woodcutting is allowed within the road prism and 100' of the road for the first 1.5 miles to the 150 spur road junction. Continue woodcutting within road prism and within 100' of the south side of the road for 2.3 miles. Continue wood cutting within road prism and both sides of the road to the East end junction with the 5810 road approximately 1.5 miles. Spur road 150 is road prism and within 100' of the south side of the road only. Spur road 160 is road prism only.
5830	Wood cutting is allowed within the road prism and 100' of the road for the first 0.8 miles. Continue road prism and within 100' of the South side of the road for the next 2.2 miles. Continue road prism and within 100' of both sides of the road for the remainder of the road. On spur roads 130, 140, and 145 wood cutting is allowed within the road prism only.
63	No wood cutting from the 46 road junction to the 6350 road junction due to high volume traffic and minimal turnouts. South of the 6350 road junction, wood cutting is only allowed within the road prism and within 100 feet of the east side road.
6310	No wood cutting from the 63 junction to the 248 spur (approximately the first 9.5 miles) – Timber Sale Activity. From the 248 spur to the 4670 road, wood cutting is allowed within the road prism and 100 feet of both sides of the road.
6311	No wood cutting – Timber Sale Activity
6320	Wood cutting is allowed within the road prism only. Wood cutting is allowed on log decks and slash piles on this road as long as they are located on the road shoulder or ditch.



6321	Wood cutting is allowed within the road prism only. Wood cutting is allowed on log decks and slash piles on this road as long as they are located on the road shoulder or ditch.

6340	For the first 4.5 miles from the 63 road junction wood cutting is allowed within the road prism only. Beyond that point, wood cutting is allowed within the road prism, and within 100 feet of both sides of the road
7010	No wood cutting from the 70 road junction to the 120 spur road junction due to Timber Sale Activity. Beyond the 120 spur, wood cutting is allowed within the road prism and within 100 feet of both sides of the road. No wood cutting on spur road 019.
7020	Wood cutting is allowed within the road prism and 100 of the West side of the road for the first mile from the 70 road junction. Beyond that point, wood cutting is allowed within the road prism only.
