

ORDER

FIRE RESTRICTIONS

WALLOWA-WHITMAN NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 36 CFR, Sec. 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on the area, roads and trails described in this order within the Wallowa Whitman National Forest, until further notice.

1. Going into or being upon an area. For the purpose of this order, this prohibition applies to persons going into or being upon the areas described in Appendix A of this order (36 CFR 261.52(e)).

2. Being on the road. For the purpose of this order, this prohibition applies to persons being on the National Forest System roads listed in Appendix B of this order (36 CFR 261.54(e)).

Pursuant to 36 CFR, Sec. 261.50 (e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

(1.) Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the prohibited act or omission.

(2.) Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. (16 U.S.C. 551 and 18 U.S.C. 3559 and 3571)

APPENDIX A

Beginning at the northwestern portion of closure area for the Pittsburg fire, the area closure is as follows: Northwest corner of Section 1, T27, R2W where it meets the Snake River east along the border of National Forest Service (NFS) lands to the border of the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest and Nez Perce National Forest; thence southerly along the border between the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest and the Nez Perce National Forest to County Road 493 (Deer Creek Road); thence westerly and south along County Road 493 (Deer Creek Road) to a distance of 200m to the Pittsburg Landing Campground; thence westerly and north at a 200m distance from the Pittsburg Landing Campground to the Snake River; thence northerly along the Snake River to the northwest corner of Section 1, T27, R2W where it meets the Snake River.

In addition, beginning at the Northwest corner of Section 1, T27, R2W where the area closure meets the Snake River, all lands within ¼ mile on the Eastside of the Snake River north to Getta Creek.


Date

Pittsburg Area Closure Map


Perimeter as of: 07/18/14
