As of Thursday, July 17, 2014:

**Fire Conditions on the San Juan National Forest are currently MODERATE.
There are currently no fire restrictions on area Forest Service or BLM Lands.**

Fuelwood permits are on sale at the Forest Service/BLM offices in Durango, Bayfield, Dolores and Pagosa, as well as at Kroeger's Hardware in Durango, City Market in Cortez, Dolores Food Market, and Cox Conoco in Mancos.

Cut Ponderosa pine logs are decked on Grouse Point Road (FS 390) and McPhee Park area (off of the Dolores Norwood Road). Also along FS755A in Saul's Creek east of Bayfield.

Campgrounds: All San Juan National Forest campgrounds are now open.

Roads on the San Juan Public Lands are open for the season.

Pagosa –Chris Mountain Road 681(closed for the season)
East Fork Road has been damaged by recent flooding, but is open.
Silverton area passes that are still blocked by snow: Black Bear

Trails are coming into good condition. Afternoon monsoon rain and thunderstorms have begun for the season. Trail crews have just begun for the season so expect downed trees and difficult stock travel on many wilderness trails.

The West Fork/Rainbow Hotsprings Trail has heavy deadfall and damage from last year's fire. Foot traffic is difficult and stock travel is not recommended. Falling tree danger is high.

Information and maps regarding changes to **travel management, road opening dates, and ATV and motorcycle trails** within the San Juan Public Lands are available at all SJNF/BLM offices or on the San Juan National Forest website.

Off Highway Vehicles, ATV's and motorcycles must have a Colorado State registration for use on public lands in Colorado. All out of state OHV's and ATV's must be permitted to be on federal and state lands. Registrations and permits are available at Colorado State Parks, most ATV dealers, the San Juan Public Lands Center, and the Bayfield, Pagosa and the Dolores District Offices.
