SPECIFICATIONS FOR BEAVERHEAD-DEERLODGE (PINTLER RD) STOCK WATER TROUGH

1) Construction

- a) General – tank shall be seamless one piece construction throughout. Tanks shall be fabricated using a male mold as to ensure a smooth non-porous interior surface.
- b) Sidewalls – Walls shall have sufficient taper to allow ease in nesting tanks for shipment and storage.
- c) Tank bottom shall have a large, 3” minimum bottom to sidewall radius. Bottom shall have non-skid floor surface.
- d) Ramps – Small animal protection ramps shall be permanently molded into the sidewalls of tanks. Ramps shall have a non-skid surface.

2) Materials

- a) General – Tanks shall be fabricated from polyester resins and fiberglass reinforcements.
- b) Fiberglass – Reinforcing material shall be 100% commercial grade glass fiber (E-glass) treated with a compatible coupling agent. Fiberglass content shall be a minimum of 30% and maximum of 40%.
- c) Resin – Resin shall be 100%, non-filled commercial grade polyester which shall meet the following specifications:
 - i) Resin content shall be a minimum of 60% and a maximum of 70%.
 - ii) Ultimate tensile strength of 13,000 psi minimum.
 - iii) Ultimate flexural strength of 19,000 psi minimum.
 - iv) Cured compressive strength of 23,000 psi minimum.
 - v) Barcol hardness 34 minimum.
