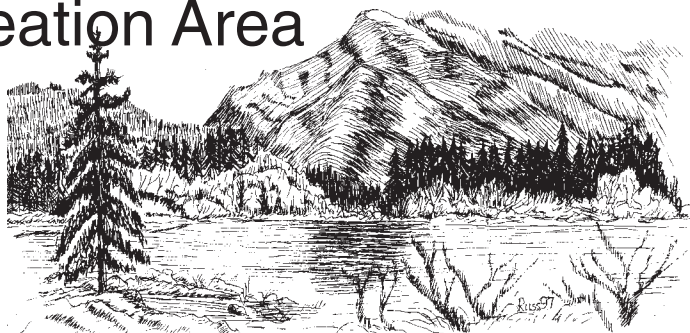


Lakes of the Smith River National Recreation Area Six Rivers National Forest



Welcome to the Smith River National Recreation Area (NRA). The NRA has several small lakes to test your luck and skill at fishing. These lakes contain eastern brook and rainbow trout and two lakes offer small catfish.

Three of the lakes may be reached by vehicle (Dry Lake, Muslatt Lake, and Sanger Lake). The others are accessed by hiking anywhere from four to 17 miles. Some trails that begin in the NRA lead to lakes in the Klamath National Forest (Buck, Devil's Punchbowl, El Capitan, Raspberry) or the Orleans District of Six Rivers National Forest (Flatiron Lake).

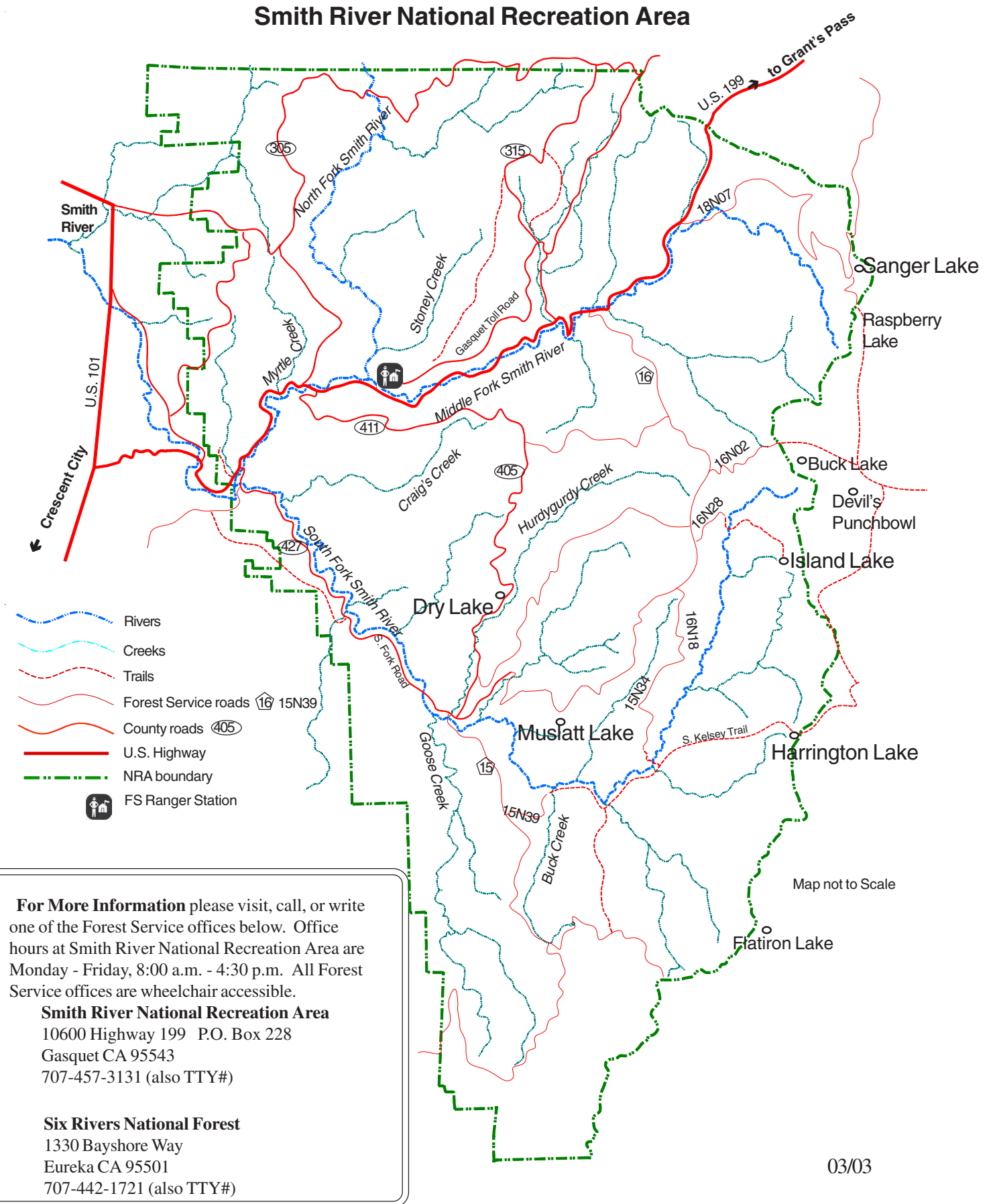
Only Muslatt and Dry Lake are usually accessible year-round; seasonal road closures affect the other three lakes.

California Sport Fishing Regulations apply at all lakes. No special closures or rules apply to any of these lakes but tackle and possession limits are in effect. Lakes are open to fishing year round, weather and road conditions permitting.

Remember that if you decide to have a campfire at a lake, you must first obtain a campfire permit. These are available free at the Smith River NRA Visitor Center in Gasquet.
