Forest Order # 2014-0604-MAL-02

### **OHV's on FOREST DEVELOPMENT ROADS OCHOCO NATIONAL FOREST MALHEUR NATIONAL FOREST**

Pursuant to 36 CFR, Sec. 261.50 (b), the following acts are prohibited on National Forest System roads described in this order within the Malheur National Forest, from July 09, 2014 and will be effect until rescinded.

- 1) Operating a Class I, Class III (without state motor vehicle registration), and /or Class IV All-Terrain Vehicle as defined by Appendix B on Forest Development Roads listed in Appendix A of this order.  
**36CFR 261.54 (a)**

Pursuant to 36 CFR, Sec. 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

- 1) Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
- 2) Any Federal, State or local law enforcement officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
- 3) An employee of the Forest Service when performing their official duties

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

### APPENDIX B – Definitions of Vehicles Included

As defined by Oregon Revised Statute 801.190 and 801.194.

Class I All-Terrain Vehicle means a motorized, off-highway recreational vehicle that:

- (1) Is 50 inches or less in width;
- (2) Has a dry weight of 1,200 pounds or less;
- (3) Travels on three or more pneumatic tires that are six inches or more in width and that are designed for use on wheels with a rim diameter of 14 inches or less;
- (4) Uses handlebars for steering;
- (5) Has a seat designed to be straddled for the operator; and
- (6) Is designed for or capable of cross-country travel on or immediately over land, water, sand, snow, ice, marsh, swampland or other natural terrain.

Class III All-Terrain Vehicle means a motorcycle that travels on two tires and that is actually being operated off highway.

Class IV All-Terrain Vehicle means any motorized vehicle that:

- (a) Travels on four or more pneumatic tires that are six inches or more in width and that are designed for use on wheels with a rim diameter of 14 inches or less;
- (b) Is designed for or capable of cross country travel on or immediately over land, water, sand, snow, ice, marsh, swampland or other natural terrain;
- (c) Has nonstraddle seating;
- (d) Has a steering wheel for steering control;
- (e) Has a dry weight of 1,800 pounds or less; and
- (f) Is 65 inches wide or less at its widest point.

### Statement of Need:

This order is written in response to a 1999 Oregon state law change that effectively legalized the use of Class I and III ATV's on single lane roads with turn-out. Prior to the law change the forest depended on state law to regulate ATV use on forest roads. The Forest Leadership Team identified certain single lane roads where mixed vehicle use, primarily due to high traffic volumes, would not be appropriate. This order closes those roads to Class I, IV, and unregistered Class III ATV's. Previous order 06-0488 was amended to include sections of Forest Roads 3920 and 1516 after road safety analysis were completed. Order 2011-0604-MAL-01 superseded forest order 06-0488. Order 2011-0604-MAL-01 was amended by this order to include Class III ATV's with increased use. In July of 2014 the 1516 was modified to permit mixed use traffic and omitted in order 2014-0604-MAL-02.

### Enforcement Procedures:

Enforcement actions can be taken by Law Enforcement Officers (LEO), Special Agent (SA) or Forest Protection Officers (FPO). Issuance of warning notices and citations will be done by any of the above listed officers. Any physical arrest will be performed only by LEOs or SAs.

### Posting:

Signing will be used at all major points where ATV's may legally enter the FS road system. The District and Forest are responsible for posting the closed roads.
