Some of the finest fishing on the Western Slope!

The Grand Mesa is well known for its numerous lakes. In all, some 300 lakes and reservoirs lie on top the Grand Mesa. The following provides information about the use of these lakes and reservoirs: *(if a lake is not listed, there are no restrictions)*



1. **Carson Lake** does not allow any motor or non-motorized boats, rafts or flotation tubes.

2. Non-motorized boats or rafts only:

Lakes with special State of Colorado fishing regulations:

Bull Basin Reservoir #1, Bull Creek Reservoirs #1&2, Connecting Channels, Silver Lake, and Griffith Reservoir:

Artificial flies and lures only. Bag, possession and minimum size for trout is two fish and 16 inches long.

Youngs Creek Reservoir #1, 2, & 3:

Artificial flies and lures only. Cutthroat and trout must be returned to the water immediately.

Kitson Reservoir:

Bag, possession and minimum size for grayling is two fish and 16 inches long.

Important!!

Zebra and Quagga

Mussels are two Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) in the Grand Mesa waters and they are a serious threat to the native fish' food chain. Adult mussels can attach or "hitchhike" to any surface and live several days out of water. Help prevent the spread of AIS by following the "Clean, Drain, and Dry" method.
