


EXISTING CONDITION ROAD MAPS

HOW TO PROVIDE YOUR COMMENTS DIRECTLY ON THE MAP

If you are providing information on printed copies of the maps, it is most helpful if the information coming to us is consistent. We recommend the following process:

1. Take a look at the **Red**, **Green** and **Gray** roads in your favorite areas on the maps and see if they match how you feel they are being used or not used. If not, then please update the **Red** or **Green** roads, or add information to **Gray** roads directly on a copy of that section of the map by:
 - a. **Highlighting roads in GREEN** – If **Red** or **Gray** roads are being used on-the-ground by motorized vehicles, highlight them in **GREEN** on the map and write the type of vehicle using the road (OHV, full size, motorcycle, UTV) next to it or in the margin of the map with a line to the road you've highlighted
 - b. **Highlighting roads in PINK** – If **Green** or **Gray** roads are physically closed on-the-ground and/or are not being used by motorized vehicles, highlight them in **PINK**.
2. Fill out a form on each road and return to the Forest Service. If you need assistance, please call 541-962-8501 or 541-523-1246.



Comment Example:

Your map indicates this road red (closed), and I have highlighted this road green, because I ride my ATV up this road as a disabled user for hunting.

Example: This road is green on the map, and I highlighted it pink because it is not passable due to trees growing in the middle of the road.

LEGEND

- GREEN:** Roads that are open and being used by some type of motorized vehicle during some portion of the year (this includes roads with seasonal closures).
- RED:** Roads that are closed, either by a Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) order or with a constructed barrier as the result of a NEPA decision, and are not being used by motorized vehicles.
- YELLOW:** Roads that have been closed, either by a CFR or after a NEPA decision, and have had a physical closure device installed, but are being used by motorized vehicles.
- Gray:** Roads which have been closed at some point in time, but neither the public nor the Forest Service have reported any motorized vehicle use information for these roads (includes roads that have grown in and are impassable, as well as roads which may be used but no further information provided).

HOW TO PRINT FROM THE WEB OR CD

1. You must have Adobe Reader to view and print these maps. A free download of Adobe Reader is available at: <http://get.adobe.com/reader/>.
2. Maps can also be found online at: <http://www.fs.usda.gov/goto/ExistingConditionRoadMaps>
3. To find which map you wish to view, open the Map Locations document and determine which map numbers cover your area of interest.
4. Double click on the map you wish to view and the map will open in your browser window. Use the Scroll Bar on the right to move the map up and down to find the location you wish to view.
5. Each map is 36" x 48" in size. To print the entire map, it needs to be printed on a plotter capable of printing maps of this size.
6. To zoom and print a smaller section of the map on your home computer, open the PDF file on your computer and from the Edit tab at the top of your screen, select "Take a Snapshot".
7. Scroll to the portion of the map you wish to Snapshot, use the cursor to highlight that area. Click "File" at the top of the page and select "Print". Uncheck "Choose paper Source by PDF Size Range".
8. It will print on 8.5" x 11" paper and you can either choose "Actual Size" and it will print as much of the area you selected as fits on that size of paper OR you can choose "Fit" and it will shrink the portion of the map you chose in order to fit it all on the paper.
