


ATTENTION ALL USERS OF THE CARSON ICEBERG WILDERNESS:

INFORMATION ON THE CHEMICAL TREATMENT OF SILVER KING CREEK BETWEEN LLEWELLYN FALLS AND SNODGRASS CREEK

August 18-22, 2014

The California Department of Fish and Wildlife in cooperation with the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest and the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service **will be chemically treating Silver King Creek and its tributaries (Tamarack Lake Creek, Tamarack Creek, Coyote Creek, and several unnamed tributaries) below Llewellyn Falls to Snodgrass Creek.**



In order for the project to be conducted as efficiently and safely as possible, **it is strongly recommended that the public not visit the portion of the wilderness within the Project Area during this time period.** The treatment will involve a large crew of people and considerable equipment. **Treated waters** will have a slight odor for several days and there will be a temporary change in water quality. **Drinking or making contact with treated waters is not advised.** This notice is intended to discourage the use of the water as a safety precaution. The intent of this project is to restore the Paiute cutthroat trout to its native habitat and potentially remove the species from the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service Endangered Species List.
