

Superior National Forest Travel Management Rule – Subpart A

Roads Study -- Providing Comments

The Superior National Forest plans to study the risks and benefits for visitors and the environment associated with the Forest’s road system. The analysis, referred to as “Subpart A,” is part of the implementation of the 2005 Travel Management Rule, 36 CFR 212. The report, to be completed by October 2015, will identify a road system that considers access for management activities and the public, minimizes environmental impacts, and can be maintained within budgetary constraints. This part of the implementation of the Travel Management Rule is an ***information-gathering study, not a decision-making process.***

The Forest Service values public participation. Communications from the public, including commenters’ names and contact information will be compiled as part of the public record for this project and will be provided to future environmental analysis (NEPA) teams for consideration in a future more in-depth analysis.

If you would like to share comments on specific Forest Service roads that are important to you, or if you have ideas on how to best address maintaining roads with decreasing budgets, please provide your input via this comment form before November 21, 2014.
