Hunters may hunt nuisance animals (beaver, coyote, fox, nutria, skunk, and wild hogs) on the National Forests in Mississippi in accordance with state regulations, according to federal law enforcement officials. The Forest Service will continue to work with its state partner, the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks, on hunting regulations on the national forest.
