Linear Wildlife Openings

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on Forest Systems Roads as described in this order, on the Pisgah Ranger District, Pisgah National Forest. This closure order is in effect from July 21, 2014 through July 21, 2019.

1. Use of motor vehicles, non-motorized vehicles or wheeled conveyances (bicycles).
36 CFR 261.54 (a)
2. Riding, hitching, tethering or hobbling a horse or other saddle or pack animal.
36 CFR 261. 58 (aa)



2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
