TEMPORARY AREA CLOSURE

PROHIBITIONS:

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. 551 and 36 C.F.R 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited within the "restricted area" of the Douglas Ranger District, Coronado National Forest, Cochise County, Arizona, as described in this Order, and as depicted on the attached map hereby incorporated into this order as Exhibit A.

1. Entering or using a portion of National Forest Lands more specifically described as an approximate 700 foot wide swath that lies directly to the west of and adjacent to FS Road 42 from the bridge near the Stewart Campground to the bridge near the Sunny Flat Campground. **36 CFR 261.53(e)**
2. Being on National Forest System Roads 42A (Herb Martyr road) and 42E (South Fork Road). **36 CFR 261.54(e)**
3. Entering or using Idlewilde Campground, Stewart Campground, Sunny Flat Campground, John Hands Day Use Area, and Herb Martyr Day Use Area. **36CFR 261.53 (e)**

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (e) the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically exempting them from the effect of this Order.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

RESTRICTED AREA:

The "restricted area" is defined as R 31E T 18S Sections 3, 4, 7, 9, 16 and R 30E T 18S Sections 12, 13, 14. Closure affects three and six-tenths (3.6) miles of road, 63.3 acres of National Forest Lands, and 5 developed recreation sites in the Cave Creek Recreation Area of the Chiricahua Mountains.


PURPOSE:

To allow for public safety in the Cave Creek Recreation Area Campgrounds, Recreation Facilities and the area near the Columbus Electric Co-op Power Transmission Line after recent flood events have caused significant road damage, recreational site damage, and infrastructure creating public safety concerns.

IMPLEMENTATION:

1. This Order will be in effect on October 5, 2014 and shall remain in effect until October 5, 2015, or until rescinded, whichever event occurs first.
2. This Order supersedes, rescinds, and replaces any previous orders prohibiting the same acts covered by this Order.
3. Any violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 for individuals and \$10,000.00 for organizations and/or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months. [Title 16 USC 551, Title 18 USC 3571(b) (6), Title 18 USC 3581 (b) (7)].



TEMPORARY AREA CLOSURE

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and Title 36 CFR 261.50 (a) the following acts are prohibited in the area described in this order, and depicted on the attached map hereby incorporated into this order as Exhibit A, all within the Santa Catalina Ranger District, Coronado National Forest, Pima County, Arizona:

PROHIBITIONS:

1. **Parking a motorized vehicle between Mile Markers 5.0 and 7.0 along Pima County Road 371, also known as Redington Road. 36 CFR 261.58(g)**
2. **Discharging a firearm, air rifle paint ball gun, gas gun or archery equipment between Mile Markers 5.0 and 7.0 of Pima County Road 371, also known as Redington Road, or within 0.6 miles of that segment of the road. 36 CFR 261.58(m)**

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (e) the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

AREA DESCRIBED:

The restricted area is the segment of Pima County Road 371, also known as Redington Road, between Mile Markers 5.0 and 7.0. This area is located at T13S, R17E, S 30, 31 Gila and Salt River Meridian (As shown on the attached map).

PURPOSE:

The purpose of the temporary area closure is for the following purposes:

- To allow proper analysis and cleanup of three recreational target shooting areas along Redington Road (Mile Markers 5.0 and 7.0) without public interference.
- To assure the protection of public health and safety by prohibiting the recreational discharge of firearms.


IMPLEMENTATION:

1. This Order shall be in effect when signed and shall remain in effect until September 30, 2015 or until it is rescinded, whichever is earlier.
2. This Order supersedes, rescinds, and replaces any previous orders prohibiting the same acts covered by this order.

3. Any violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 for individuals and \$10,000.00 for organizations, and/or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months. [Title 16 USC 551, Title 18 USC 3571(b) (6), Title 18 USC 3581 (b) (7)].


Redington Pass Shooting Closure 03-05-05-14-334

TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE

PROHIBITIONS:

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. 551 and 36 C.F.R 261.50 (b), the following acts are prohibited within the "restricted area" of the Douglas Ranger District, Coronado National Forest, Cochise County, Arizona, as described in this Order, and as depicted on the attached map hereby incorporated into this order as Exhibit A.

1. Being on National Forest System Roads 314 and 685. **36 CFR 261.54(e)**

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (e) the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically exempting them from the effect of this Order.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

RESTRICTED AREA:

The "restricted area" is defined as National Forest System Roads 314 and 685 located in Township 19 South, Range 31 East and is confined to Sections 7, 9, 10, 13, 14, 15, 18, 20, 21 and 22. This closure affects 10 miles of road in the Chiricahua Mountains.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this order is to allow for public safety in the Chiricahua Mountains after recent flood events have caused significant road damage and erosion.

IMPLEMENTATION:

1. This Order will be in effect when signed and shall remain in effect until September 22, 2015, or until rescinded, whichever event occurs first.
2. This Order supersedes, rescinds, and replaces any previous orders prohibiting the same acts covered by this Order.
3. Any violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 for individuals and \$10,000.00 for organizations and/or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months. [Title 16 USC 551, Title 18 USC 3571(b) (6), Title 18 USC 3581 (b) (7)].


Chiricahua Mountains - Horseshoe Canyon Temporary Emergency Closure

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


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-  Roads Closed in Horseshoe Area

PROHIBITIONS:

1. Being on National Forest System Roads 74E, 628, 4243, 4244, 4245, 4246, 4248, and 7181.
36 CFR 261.54(e)

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (e) the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically exempting them from the effect of this Order.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

RESTRICTED AREA:

The "restricted area" is defined as the following National Forest System Roads (NFSR): NFSR 74E, NFSR 628, NFSR 4243, NFSR 4244, NFSR 4245, NFSR 4246, NFSR 4248, and NFSR 7181 located within T 19S R 30E Sections 11, 13, 14, 17, 18, 19, 22, 23, 24, 26, 27, 30, and 31. This closure affects 17 miles of roads in the Chiricahua Mountains. See Exhibit A.

PURPOSE:

To allow for public safety in the Chiricahua Mountains after recent flood events have caused significant road damage and erosion.

IMPLEMENTATION:

1. This Order will be in effect when signed and shall remain in effect until September 22, 2015, or until rescinded, whichever event occurs first.
2. This Order supersedes, rescinds, and replaces any previous orders prohibiting the same acts covered by this Order.
3. Any violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 for individuals and \$10,000.00 for organizations and/or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months. [Title 16 USC 551, Title 18 USC 3571(b) (6), Title 18 USC 3581 (b) (7)].




PINALEÑO ECOSYSTEM RESTORATION PROJECT AREA AND TRAIL CLOSURE

PROHIBITIONS:

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are **prohibited** in the areas and on the trail as described in this Order, and as depicted on the attached map hereby incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A, (“restricted areas and restricted trail”), within the Safford Ranger District, Coronado National Forest, Graham County, Arizona:

1. Going into or being upon the “restricted areas”. **36 CFR 261.52(e)**
2. Being on the “restricted trail”. **36 CFR 261.55(a)**

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.52 (e) the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
3. Contractors, subcontractors, and associated employees involved in the commercial activities associated with the PERP restoration project in the official performance of their duties.

RESTRICTED AREAS AND RESTRICTED TRAIL:

1. The closed areas include Cunningham Campground, Cunningham Trailhead, and the Moonshine dispersed camping area, as illustrated on the attached map. These areas are located in Township 9S, Range 24E, Sections 4, 10, and 13.
2. Cunningham Loop Trail (Trail #316) in its entirety.


PURPOSE:

3. Any violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 for individuals and \$10,000.00 for organizations, and/or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months. [Title 16 USC 551, Title 18 USC 3571(b)(6), Title 18 USC 3581 (b)(7)].
