



4FRI Restoration Accomplishments

Overview: Performance measures are used to analyze restoration accomplishments for Collaborative Forest Landscape Restoration (CFLR) projects such as 4FRI. This document provides a summary of those accomplishments over the past five years over 2.4 million acres across four forests.

1. Accomplishments by Performance Measures Summary: 2010-2014

- 1.1. **Catastrophic fire risk has been reduced** across approximately **300,000 acres** through forest hazardous fuels treatments.
- 1.2. **Active crown fire risk** has been reduced across 12% of the 4FRI landscape.
- 1.3. Risk of **stand replacing fire** has been reduced across 23% of the 4FRI landscape.
- 1.4. **Wildlife habitat** has been improved on approximately 300,000 acres.
- 1.5. More than **32,000 acres of timber** have been harvested from forest lands totaling approximately 773,000 CCF (100 cubic feet volume) sold. This is enough lumber to build over 65,000 homes.
- 1.6. Successful treatment of **invasive plants** has been accomplished on more than 14,000 acres.
- 1.7. Approximately **800 miles of trails** have been maintained or improved.
- 1.8. 4FRI task orders in progress have produced enough green biomass energy to power approximately **100,000 homes** for a year.
- 1.9. More than **1.1 billion kilowatt hours of bio-energy** have been produced from 4FRI green biomass removed from forest lands.
- 1.10. **Watershed function** and resilience has been sustained on 296,657 acres.
