Pre-Announcement Outreach -- The Gila National Forest is looking to fill a District Recreation Program Manager position. Duties -- This position serves as the primary staff to the District Ranger, with responsibility for managing, planning, scheduling, coordinating, reviewing, and reporting on the recreation program on the District as well as providing program guidance to two adjoining districts. Supervisory duties include one GS-7 trails foreman and one GS-5 recreation technician along with one or more temporary employees. This staff position manages a busy recreation program across three districts including developed recreation, dispersed recreation, recreation residences, outfitter and guides, recreation events and wilderness. Developed recreation includes 16 campgrounds, 24 trailheads, 2 picnic sites, 1 fishing site, 4 interpretive/ observation sites, and 1 boating site. Dispersed recreation

includes camping outside of developed campgrounds and travel management of roads and trails. Special uses include Outfitter and Guide permits.

ABOUT THE FOREST

The Gila National Forest, 3.3 million acres of mountainous forest and rangeland, rises proudly above the desert country of New Mexico. The Gila boasts more federal land than any other national forest in the contiguous United States and is home to the first designated wilderness area.

Unique features on the forest include an ancient Mogollon site now preserved as the Gila Cliff Dwellings National Monument, the historic water pipeline of the Catwalk of the Whitewater Canyon, 170 miles of the Continental Divide Trail, and the Aldo Leopold, Gila, and Blue Range Wilderness Areas.

ABOUT GLENWOOD RANGER DISTRICT

The Glenwood Ranger District, at 529,860 acres, has a varied ecosystem that ranges from desert to wet mixed conifer forests. The district encompasses two wilderness areas; the Blue Range Wilderness, which is all within the borders of the district, as well as the western side of the Gila Wilderness. The district has 6,500 acres of Inventoried Roadless areas.

The San Francisco River runs through the middle of the district. West of the river to the Arizona border, is a predominately pinyon/juniper grassland ecosystem, with some Ponderosa pine. The northern portion of this area is mixed conifer, including portions of the Blue Range Wilderness. East of the river, the ecosystem starts in pinyon/juniper grasslands and quickly gains elevation to wet mixed conifer at 10,000 feet as it enters the Gila Wilderness.

GLENWOOD AND THE LOCAL AREA

Location: Glenwood is a town of approximately 300 people, known for its spectacular views of the Mogollon Mountains, Catwalk National Recreation Trail and proximity to the ghost town of Mogollon. It lies on the southwest western border of the state approximately 65 miles northwest of Silver City. The elevation in Glenwood is approximately 4,770 feet, but the district ranges in elevation up to 10,535 feet.

Climate: The majority of the Glenwood area landscape is considered high desert with predominately pinyon and juniper vegetation. Summer temperatures average 50 to 98 degrees. Spring and fall temperatures average between 45 to 75 degrees and winter temperatures range from 25 to 55 degrees with a few colder days. Snow is anticipated in the Glenwood area only about 5 days per year, usually clearing off by mid-afternoon. Sunshine is abundant most all year round. Typically starting around July 4, monsoon rains brings a wet season that lasts approximately two months.

Cultural and Recreation Opportunities: The community has a volunteer library, Community Center and a community park. Recreational opportunities are plentiful. Hunting, hiking, backpacking, fishing, horseback riding and rock hounding are among the most popular outdoor activities. Whitewater Canyon recreation area which includes the Catwalk National Recreation Trail is a wonderful natural area that draws about 40,000 visitors each year from around the world. Local history is evident in mining ghost towns, ranches and prehistoric Indian sites.

Medical: There is a local volunteer fire department and ambulance service. Gila Regional Medical Center in Silver City provides full service hospital facilities. There are medical clinics in both Reserve (40 miles north) and Gila (36 miles south).

Schools: There is an elementary school (K-3) in Glenwood that averages approximately 10 students. Students in grades 4-12, are bussed to Reserve, NM. Western New Mexico University is located in Silver City and provides quality programs for traditional and non-traditional students. The community of Cliff, in Grant County, has an elementary through high school system as well.

Employment: Glenwood is made up of a very diverse community including ranchers, retirees, state/federal employees, local shopkeepers and artists.

Housing: Housing availability in Glenwood is limited and real estate prices are fairly high. The Gila/Cliff area, 30 miles south, and community of Reserve to the north, offers more housing. Some employees choose to commute from Silver City, about an hour and ten minute drive one way. There may be government housing available in Glenwood.

Transportation: Glenwood is approximately four hours from four major cities: Albuquerque, NM; Phoenix, AZ; Tucson, AZ; and El Paso, TX.
