SYNOPSIS

The United States Forest Service (USFS) investigated the Pfeiffer Fire which was reported to the Monterey County Communications Center at approximately 23:46 on Sunday, December 15, 2013, within the Los Padres National Forest boundary. The first caller observed flames on Pfeiffer Ridge across from the Big Sur Lodge, which is located along Highway 1 in Big Sur, California.

The cause of the fire was determined to be high resistance heating of the Pfeiffer Ridge Mutual Water Company electrical control wires immediately adjacent to a steel water pipe line. The high resistance heating of the electrical control wires created a competent ignition source for this fire. The first fuel ignited was accumulated dried leaves and redwood needles.

All other fire cause categories were investigated and excluded.

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INTRODUCTION

The United States Forest Service (USFS) investigated the Pfeiffer Fire which was reported to the Monterey County Communications Center at approximately 23:46 on Sunday, December 15, 2013, within the Los Padres National Forest boundary. The first caller observed flames on Pfeiffer Ridge across from the Big Sur Lodge, which is located along Highway 1 in Big Sur, California.

The Pfeiffer Fire grew rapidly, requiring immediate evacuation of residents in the vicinity of the fire. The fire burned-over 34 residences, 4 outbuildings, and consumed 917 acres of federal, state, and private lands. Three injuries were incurred by fire fighting personnel.

Special Agent (S/A) **b6 & b7(C)** was assigned as case agent in this matter. S/A **b6 & b7(C)** was assigned as the lead Origin and Cause Investigator in this matter.

Fire and Initial Response

On December 15, 2013, at approximately 23:46 the front desk clerk at the Big Sur Lodge in the Pfeiffer-Big Sur State Park called 911 to report a fire across Highway 1 on the hillside below Pfeiffer Ridge. At approximately 23:52 the Monterey County Communications Center (County COMM) was in contact with **b6 & b7(C)** **b6 & b7(C)** of the Big Sur Volunteer Fire Department (BSVFD). **b6 & b7(C)** told County COMM that she could see flames out her front door and to request CALFIRE to respond. At approximately 23:56 **b6 & b7(C)** **b6 & b7(C)** reported that the fire was right below her house. At approximately 23:59 **b6 & b7(C)** advised County COMM that they may need to do some evacuations. **b6 & b7(C)** had already started



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requesting additional resources, and at approximately 00:12 [b6 & b7(C)] told County COMM they would need all the resources they could get. County COMM was already receiving multiple calls from local residents on Pfeiffer Ridge about the fire, and at approximately 00:14 a 911 caller asked County COMM if she needed to evacuate. Residents along Pfeiffer Ridge were already calling each other and trying to determine how to assist each other and evacuate the ridge, which has only two limited access routes off the ridge. (EXHIBIT 1 Monterey County Communications Center Log, Monday December 16, 2013 03:45)

Fire Overruns Pfeiffer Ridge

[b6 & b7(C)] called USFS Engine [b6 & b7(C)] at approximately 00:10 to advise him of the fire on Pfeiffer Ridge and request assistance. [b6 & b7(C)] called USFS [b6 & b7(C)] [b6 & b7(C)] [b6 & b7(C)] and [b6 & b7(C)] drove north on Highway 1 from the Big Sur Station to a point just past the River Inn to scout and size up the fire. [b6 & b7(C)] believed he saw a glow from the Buzzards Roost Trail area and thought it was low intensity backing fire. [b6 & b7(C)] and [b6 & b7(C)] then proceeded to assist BSVFD with the response. [b6 & b7(C)] went up Pfeiffer Ridge road and observed the fire on both sides of Pfeiffer Ridge at approximately 01:30 and estimated flame lengths of 10-15 feet from the ground, winds 10-15 ENE. [b6 & b7(C)] estimated that winds along Highway 1 were variable at 2-3 gusting to 5.

[b6 & b7(C)] recalled that the CALFIRE [b6 & b7(C)] Crew, supervised by CALFIRE [b6 & b7(C)] [b6 & b7(C)] was the first fire unit in the area of the pump house along the Big Sur River. (EXHIBIT 2 S/A [b6 & b7(C)] Supplemental Incident Report-Engine [b6 & b7(C)] Initial Response)

[b6 & b7(C)] property was reported to be the first overrun by the fire. [b6 & b7(C)] told investigators that her [b6 & b7(C)] was the first structure to be struck by the fire, and that the fire was "fully crowning" moving in the treetops, moving uphill, and creating its own wind. [b6 & b7(C)] stated the fire came up a draw directly below her house and burned upslope in a westerly direction and then moved north pushed by the wind. The fire was flanking to the north as it went through the saddle and over the ridge. (EXHIBIT 3 Origin and Cause Report, S/A [b6 & b7(C)] & EXHIBIT 4 Memorandum of Interview, [b6 & b7(C)], December 21, 2013)

CALFIRE [b6 & b7(C)] Crew at the Big Sur River



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On December 20, 2013, S/A [b6 & b7(C)], S/A [b6 & b7(C)] and Fire Prevention Technician (FPT) [b6 & b7(C)] met with [b6 & b7(C)] along the access road that leads to the Buzzards Roost Trail. The group walked together to the area of the Buzzards Roost Trail that [b6 & b7(C)] and his crew responded to during the initial attack. The CALFIRE [b6 & b7(C)] Crew, supervised by [b6 & b7(C)] was the first fire unit to respond to the area of the Big Sur River pump house and the Buzzards Roost Trail during the initial attack on the morning of December 16, 2013. [b6 & b7(C)] described what he observed and his actions during the initial response to the Pfeiffer Fire to the investigators. [b6 & b7(C)] told investigators that he arrived in the area at approximately 01:45 hours and staged. [b6 & b7(C)] orders were to go to the pump house near the heel of the fire and establish an anchor point. [b6 & b7(C)] and his crew arrived in the area of the pump house sometime after 02:15. When [b6 & b7(C)] arrived, he observed two adult white males with backpacks coming from the north along the river trail. [b6 & b7(C)] was headed north to assess the fire. He described both subjects as white male adults. One of the subjects was younger with long hair and a beard. [b6 & b7(C)] stated the other subject was older and he did not think he had facial hair. [b6 & b7(C)] stated both men were wearing back packs and passed by quickly with few words exchanged.

[b6 & b7(C)] continued along the trail and directed his crew to start cutting fire line and putting in hose lays at the heel of the fire. [b6 & b7(C)] described cutting fire line with hand tools and dragging fire hose uphill along the cleared ground. [b6 & b7(C)] stated the fire was backing very slowly. He described the fire behavior as "backing, rolling out and making new smaller runs on the flanks of the fire." [b6 & b7(C)] identified the area where the fire was initially backing down hill towards the pump house from uphill towards Pfeiffer Ridge. The utility water lines ran directly upslope in the middle of the area [b6 & b7(C)] pointed out. [b6 & b7(C)] stated the fire origin area could not be too far uphill from where he stood due to the slow rate of fire backing movement he observed. [b6 & b7(C)] showed investigators exactly where he and his team cut the initial fire lines flanking the backing movement of the fire. The area was uphill from where the trail and the utility water pipelines met. This information later helped corroborate the Origin and Cause Examination on December 21, 2013. **(EXHIBIT 3-Origin and Cause Report, S/A [b6 & b7(C)])**

Investigators Size Up the Fire

S/A [b6 & b7(C)] was notified about the Pfeiffer Fire on December 16, 2013, at approximately 05:30 by the Los Padres Forest Dispatch Center. S/A [b6 & b7(C)] responded to the Incident Command Post (ICP), arriving at approximately 08:30. S/A [b6 & b7(C)] then met with FPT [b6 & b7(C)] along North Coast Ridge Road. The North



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Coast Ridge Road provided a vantage point to observe the entire east, north, and south sides of the fire. The Pfeiffer Fire was walking, or slowly moving, in a southerly and westerly direction, and it appeared to be mainly terrain driven at approximately 09:30. FPT [REDACTED] observations from his response to the fire made him suspect the general origin area may be located in the vicinity of the Buzzards Roost trail between Pfeiffer Ridge and CA HWY 1.

S/A [REDACTED] and FPT [REDACTED] walked along the Big Sur River to the Buzzards Roost trail. S/A [REDACTED] observed the fire backing slowly downhill towards the river trail and making advancing runs through brush and redwoods. The Buzzards Roost trail became impassable due to the fire activity. S/A [REDACTED] observed ground litter and smaller trees turning white hot from the fire.

S/A [REDACTED] and FPT [REDACTED] taped off the access to the Buzzards Roost trail near the intersection of the state parks connector trail coming from the Pfeiffer Big Sur State Park Campground and the river trail. **(EXHIBIT 5 S/A [REDACTED] Supplemental Incident Report-Initial Response)**

Origin & Cause Examination

S/A [REDACTED] was assigned as the lead Origin and Cause investigator and was assisted by FPT [REDACTED] S/A [REDACTED] and FPT [REDACTED] determined the specific origin area was located in an area midslope below Pfeiffer Ridge immediately adjacent to two utility water pipelines owned and operated by the Rancho Chaparral Mutual Water Company and the Pfeiffer Ridge Mutual Water Company. Investigators found electrical wires that were not protected or encased by a rigid conduit running parallel to the pipelines and some light backpacking equipment within the specific origin area. S/A [REDACTED] procured an electrical engineer to assist with the investigation due to the presence of the electrical wiring in the origin area.

The Origin and Cause examination determined that the point of origin was adjacent to the pipelines. One of the mutual water company electrical control wires was found immediately adjacent to a section of pipe with a raised deposit that indicated possible arcing.

The following is an abridged quote of the Origin and Cause Report that explains the examination in detail:

General Origin Area

On Saturday December 21, 2013, at approximately 10:30 S/A [REDACTED] and FPT [REDACTED] began a systematic



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examination of the GOA to determine the point of origin and cause of the Pfeiffer Fire. Large burn patterns, macro indicators and witness statements helped determine the fire generally burned from the East to the West, up the East facing slope, over Pfeifer Ridge and then back down West facing slopes and laterally along Pfeifer Ridge. The investigators then walked into the fire burn area from the direction of the fire's advancing run while examining, making notes, photographing and marking directional burn pattern indicators.

FPT [b6 & b7(C)] and S/A [b6 & b7(C)] identified the general origin area based on macro fire indicators, witness statements, and fire burn patterns; along with topography, weather and fuel factors. FPT [b6 & b7(C)] and S/A [b6 & b7(C)] located and followed macro fire burn pattern indicators leading to the fire's general origin area which validated the general origin area previously flagged by S/A [b6 & b7(C)] and FPT [b6 & b7(C)]. FPT [b6 & b7(C)] and S/A [b6 & b7(C)] located and identified numerous macro-scale burn pattern indicators on the larger vegetation and rocks. The macro, directional burn pattern indicators included angle of char, damage differential, sooting and protection which were consistent with freezing indicators and our overall U-shape burn pattern observations.

At approximately 1430 hours, FPT [b6 & b7(C)] and S/A [b6 & b7(C)] located the general origin area. The general origin area was located at Latitude N36° 15' 1.5" x Longitude W121° 47' 18.9". (NAD 27) S/A [b6 & b7(C)] walked laterally (side hill) to the north flank/unburned area and continued down hill a short distance toward the Buzzards Roost Trail. S/A [b6 & b7(C)] located the Buzzards Roost Trail and walked to the location previously identified by Cal-Fire [b6 & b7(C)]. S/A [b6 & b7(C)] called out to FPT [b6 & b7(C)] verifying his location at the general origin area. This corroborated [b6 & b7(C)] statement and observations. S/A [b6 & b7(C)] noted the general origin area located by FPT [b6 & b7(C)] and himself was directly upslope from the location previously identified by [b6 & b7(C)] as the origin area. S/A [b6 & b7(C)] walked back upslope observing fire backing indicators such as angle of char, low intensity burning, staining and protection. S/A [b6 & b7(C)] and FPT [b6 & b7(C)] continued their systematic examination and identified the specific area of origin.

Specific Origin Area-Camping Equipment and Water Utility and Electrical Control Lines

Within the specific origin area FPT [b6 & b7(C)] and S/A [b6 & b7(C)] identified utility water pipe lines, several exposed electrical wires, and remnants of abandoned camping equipment. The camping equipment appeared old. The equipment was scattered along the hillside and did not appear to have been recently

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used or occupied. There was no flat sleeping or camping area, no campfire ring, no bedding, no clothing, and no tent(s). The abandoned camping equipment located in the general origin area consisted of a MSR propane cylinder in two pieces and a partially melted water filter. The two pieces of the propane cylinder were located approximately 30 feet apart. The cylinder exhibited signs of a Boiling Liquid Expanding Vapor Explosion. (BLEVE) Investigators hypothesized the BLEVE took place when the propane cylinder was exposed to heat and fire. Additional evidence, located in the specific origin area consisted of three MSR cooking pots, a knife and several pieces of melted metal (thought to be aluminum). One piece of melted aluminum had what appeared to be a small a "quick release" handle attached. Investigators hypothesized the pieces of aluminum may have been part of a back packing cooking stove that would attach to the top of a propane cylinder like the one located nearby. (S/A [REDACTED] later determined the melted and metal remnants were likely the remains of LED flashlight/lantern) The investigators photographed and collected the camping equipment as evidence.

At approximately 16:30 hours, S/A [REDACTED] and FPT [REDACTED] flagged off/secured the specific origin area. S/A [REDACTED] notified SA [REDACTED] informing him the origin area was located and evidence was collected for investigative examination. S/A [REDACTED] and FPT [REDACTED] departed the area at approximately 16:45 hours.

Investigators examined the propane cylinder considering and rejecting the possibility that it created competent ignition source. Investigators were able to rule out this hypothesis for several reasons. First, the propane cylinder and melted aluminum pieces were not located in the specific origin area. Second, the propane cylinder would have to have been attached to a stove at the threaded portion of the cylinder at the time of ignition and cylinder explosion. The threads on the propane cylinder were intact indicating a stove was not attached at the time of explosion. Third, no camp stove or remnants of a camp stove were located any time during this investigation.

Point of Origin Examination

On December 22, 2013, S/A [REDACTED] and FPT [REDACTED] returned to the general origin area. Following the observed fire spread indicators, investigators located the specific origin area at the heel of the U-shaped burn pattern on the East facing slope. Lower intensity burning had taken place at the specific origin area where FPT [REDACTED] and S/A [REDACTED] observed and documented micro-scale fire directional burn indicators.



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The investigators located the specific origin area where micro burn indicators led to an area approximately 3-5 square feet. In that area investigators located three MSR camp cooking pots, several pieces of melted metal (suspected aluminum), a knife, four small gears, a small glass digital display and electronic panel, possibly from an electronic/digital watch.

S/A [b6 & b7(C)] and FPT [b6 & b7(C)] first did a visually grid search of the area. Investigators photographed, removed and collected items located in the specific origin area. S/A [b6 & b7(C)] and FPT [b6 & b7(C)] next, ran a high power magnet over the entire specific origin area. Finally, FPT [b6 & b7(C)] and S/A [b6 & b7(C)] sifted ash in areas where items of interest were located.

S/A [b6 & b7(C)] worked with FPT [b6 & b7(C)] tracing micro burn pattern indicators (protection, staining) to the point of origin. Burn indicators showed low-intensity burning emanated from the point of origin in a 360° pattern. At the point of origin FPT [b6 & b7(C)] and S/A [b6 & b7(C)] identified several electrical wires running parallel and immediately adjacent to the utility water pipes. The utility water pipe lines were galvanized steel. One of the wires was immediately adjacent to an area of the pipe where a raised deposit of an unknown substance indicated possible arcing. The galvanized steel pipe showed charring/discoloration and a rough texture, possibly consistent with arching, that directly corresponded to a specific area on an immediately adjacent wire where the insulation was charred and partially missing. Thinning and pitting was visibly apparent on the wire.

Most of the specific origin area was buried in several inches of white ash indicating a significant quantity of dried needles, leaves and twigs (also referred to as a receptive fuel bed) existed prior to the incident and was consumed by fire S/A [b6 & b7(C)] and FPT [b6 & b7(C)] carefully removed the white ash from the specific origin area using a leaf blower. S/A [b6 & b7(C)] and FPT [b6 & b7(C)] observed additional staining on the water pipes indicating the fire originated in the immediate area; slightly north of the water pipes. (EXHIBIT 3-Origin and Cause Report, S/A [b6 & b7(C)])

Electrical Engineer Examination

Mutual Water Pipeline Systems

On December 19, 2013, S/A [b6 & b7(C)] requested an Electrical Engineer be contracted to provide technical assistance to the fire investigation after learning from [b6 & b7(C)] (Blaze Engineering



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Construction) that exposed "romex" electrical wire that is part of a local water system ran through the suspected general origin area of the fire. (EXHIBIT 6 Supplemental Incident Report, Meeting with b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C), December 19, 2013)

b6 & b7(C) of Origin and Cause Engineering in Albany, CA was contracted. b6 & b7(C) assisted at the scene of the investigation on December 21, 22, and 24, 2013. b6 & b7(C) performed a site examination, on-site evidence examination, participated in witness interviews, and prepared a written report.

On December 21, 2013, S/A b6 & b7(C), S/A b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) met with b6 & b7(C) b6 & b7(C) (Rancho Chaparral b6 & b7(C), and b6 & b7(C) b6 & b7(C) provided information to b6 & b7(C) about the Rancho Chaparral electrical system. The pumps push water up to storage tanks on Pfeiffer Ridge. The tanks have electrical float switches. The floats control the electrical charge running through a romex electrical control wire to the electrical panel along the Big Sur River. The romex electrical line runs along the outside of the pipeline.

The two other pipeline systems operated by other water mutual operate in a similar manner. The other water mutual companies are the Bridge Partners Mutual Water Company and the Pfeiffer Ridge Mutual Water Company. The Bridge Partners pipeline is located south of the pump house. The Rancho Chaparral and Pfeiffer pipelines begin running uphill north of the pump house and run uphill immediately adjacent to one another

b6 & b7(C) told investigators that Blaze Engineering had replaced 200 feet of water pipeline for Bridge Partners on December 12-13, 2013. The project required excavation of the river trail to replace the pipeline section. (EXHIBIT 7 Supplemental Incident Report, Meeting with b6 & b7(C), b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C), December 21, 2013)

b6 & b7(C) spoke with b6 & b7(C) (Blaze Engineering Construction), b6 & b7(C) (Rancho Chaparral b6 & b7(C), and b6 & b7(C) who provided information about their activities during the fire and the general workings of the mutual water systems.

b6 & b7(C) told b6 & b7(C) that he and b6 & b7(C) went to the pump station at approximately 02:00 to 02:30 and bypassed the tank level switch control wire in the Rancho Chaparral control panel to pump water for fire suppression activities. b6 & b7(C) told b6 & b7(C) that he noticed the fire was uphill near the Pfeiffer Ridge and Rancho Chaparral water pipe lines. b6 & b7(C) did not see any fire near the Bridge Partners water pipe line.

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b6 & b7(C) physically reviewed the Bridge Partners, Rancho Chaparral, and Pfeiffer Ridge Mutual Water Companies' physical and electrical infrastructure including pumps, pipes, water storage tanks, level switches, electrical meters, control panels, and control wires.

b6 & b7(C) met S/A b6 & b7(C) at the specific origin area and examined the two romex control wires that ran along the Pfeiffer Ridge and Rancho Chaparral pipe lines. One of the control wires was a "two conductors romex wire" and the other was a "three conductors romex wire". The two pipe lines crossed each other at this location. b6 & b7(C)

b6 & b7(C) determined that one of the copper conductors belonging to the "three conductor romex wire" exhibited abnormal localized high temperature damage, melting damage, thinning of the wire diameter and matching high temperature damage evidence on one of the water pipes. There appeared to be an electrical fault near the location of the melting damage as well. The romex insulation was totally consumed. (See Exhibit 3 attachment b6 & b7(C) **Electrical Engineering Analysis Report**)

Tracing the Romex Control Wires

b6 & b7(C) assisted by S/A b6 & b7(C) and S/A b6 & b7(C) traced the "three conductors romex wire" from the origin area to the control panel. b6 & b7(C) found unprotected splicing of the romex wire at one location and noted high temperature damage at that splicing location. The romex went underground at the intersection of the Buzzards Roost Trail. b6 & b7(C) used a tone tracer and continuity measurement at the control panels with the assistance of S/A b6 & b7(C) and S/A b6 & b7(C) determined the "three conductors romex wire" was the control wire for the Pfeiffer Ridge Mutual Water Company.

b6 & b7(C) Analysis

b6 & b7(C) report analysis states:

Based on the available information, a high resistance heating at the area of origin cannot be eliminated as the probable ignition source for this fire. The first fuel ignited would most probably be the accumulated dried leaves in the area of origin. The noted melting and thinning of one of the three conductors of the Lower Pfeiffer control wire and the matching localized high temperature damage on the water pipe line would be the supporting evidence for the high resistance heating conditions. The



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black conductor,(assuming the color was not switched during the splicing) would be always energized and the white conductor would be energized when the level switch was closed. A high resistance heating ignition could occur under these conditions. (See Exhibit 3 attachment **b6 & b7(C)** Electrical Engineering Analysis Report)

Mutual Water Company Special Use Permits

The Los Padres National Forest issued a Special Use Permit (SUP) to the Pfeiffer Ridge Mutual Water Company on March 28, 1985. The Pfeiffer Ridge Mutual Water Company SUP permitted the construction, operation, and maintenance of "a buried well with 10 H.P. submersible pump and a buried 2-inchgalvanized water pipeline for domestic water supply." The permitted installation was a strip of NFS lands five feet in width located in the following Township and Range: T19S, R2E, MDB&M, Section 30, Lot 5 thence along the USFS Right of Way over Pfeiffer Ridge Road within to T19S, R1E, MDB&M, Section 25, S1/2, NE ¼, N1/2, N1/2, SW1/4. A sketch is attached to the permit. **(EXHIBIT 8 USFS SUP Pfeiffer Ridge Mutual Water Company, March 28, 1985)**

The origin of the fire was within T19S, Range 2E, MDB&M, Section 30.

The Los Padres National Forest issued a SUP to the Rancho Chaparral Mutual Water Company on December 12, 1967. The Rancho Chaparral Mutual Water Company SUP permitted: "land already occupied by the improvements for the purpose of: Operating and maintaining an existing well, pump house, and 1,470 feet of water pipeline, to provide domestic and irrigation water to private land in Section 25, T. 19 S., R 1 E., MDM." The SUP has numerous administrative amendments, including an amendment dated May 7, 1968 stating that:

- “1. The location of the well and pump-house is changed to the west side of the river, as shown on EXHIBIT A-1, attached.
2. The old well site is to be restored to the satisfaction of the District Ranger.”

(EXHIBIT 9 USFS SUP Rancho Chaparral Mutual Water Company, December 12, 1967)

Additional Investigative Activity



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Throughout the course of the investigation officers and agents developed several leads regarding persons who may have been near the fire in its early stages or had information about the possible cause of the Pfeiffer fire. The investigators pursued all viable leads and developed the information below.

Investigation of [b6 & b7(C)] Activities

Initial Contact with [b6 & b7(C)]

Just before arriving at the ICP on December 16, 2013, at 08:30, S/A [b6 & b7(C)] noticed a white male adult approximately 55 years of age walking back and forth along Highway 1 in the vicinity of the ICP. The male subject had a blue backpack and a multi colored tote bag. S/A [b6 & b7(C)] again observed the male subject, this time sitting outside the Incident Command Post after coming down from North Coast Ridge Road. S/A [b6 & b7(C)] and FPT [b6 & b7(C)] made a consensual contact with the subject. The subject was identified as [b6 & b7(C)] [b6 & b7(C)] [b6 & b7(C)] advised that he was homeless and had been camping illegally on state park land near the fire activity. [b6 & b7(C)] explained that he was camped north of the Buzzards Roost trail between Pfeiffer Ridge and CA HWY 1. [b6 & b7(C)] advised that a friend, [b6 & b7(C)] had woken him at approximately 03:00 to warn him about the fire and help him evacuate his camp. [b6 & b7(C)] advised that he believed some local young people were harassing him, or trying to scare him at night by following him or making noises near his tent at night. [b6 & b7(C)] believed that the group of young people was trying to scare him into leaving the area. [b6 & b7(C)] claimed he recently got a job at [b6 & b7(C)] [b6 & b7(C)] that is popular with area visitors. (EXHIBIT 5 S/A [b6 & b7(C)] Supplemental Incident Report-Initial Response)

Evacuation of [b6 & b7(C)]

[b6 & b7(C)] was interviewed by S/A [b6 & b7(C)] and CALFIRE Investigator [b6 & b7(C)] at the Big Sur Station on December 16, 2013. [b6 & b7(C)] was employed as a [b6 & b7(C)] at the [b6 & b7(C)] and had been so employed since July 2013. [b6 & b7(C)] provided a statement to S/A [b6 & b7(C)] that explained she was awoken at approximately 02:15 on December 16, 2013, by a State Park ranger and advised that everyone may need to evacuate due to the fire. [b6 & b7(C)] was packing some of her belongings in her car when she remembered her friend [b6 & b7(C)] was not working that day, and that he may need to be warned about the fire. [b6 & b7(C)] and a dorm mate, [b6 & b7(C)], went to warn [b6 & b7(C)] about the fire. [b6 & b7(C)] saw that the fire was in the area of the Buzzards Roost Trail and went to the area of the group camp north of the



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Buzzards Roost Trail and crossed the river to get to b6 & b7(C) campsite. b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) walked through Lewald Flat and could not see the fire from that location. b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) woke b6 & b7(C) and helped him pack some of his belongings. b6 & b7(C) walked back to her car through the group camp, while b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) walked along the trail and met b6 & b7(C) along Highway 1. b6 & b7(C) drove b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) back to the dorms at the Big Sur Station with b6 & b7(C) belongings. b6 & b7(C) estimated they were back the dorms by approximately 04:00. b6 & b7(C) drew a map which is attached to her statement which shows b6 & b7(C) camp and where she thought the fire was around 03:00. b6 & b7(C) also noted that b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) told her the fire had come down to approximately 200 feet above the trail. (EXHIBIT 10

b6 & b7(C) Written Statement and Sketch)

b6 & b7(C) was interviewed by S/A b6 & b7(C) and CALFIRE Investigator b6 & b7(C) at the Big Sur Station on December 16, 2013. b6 & b7(C) was employed as a b6 & b7(C) at the b6 & b7(C) b6 & b7(C) and had been so employed for approximately two and a half years. b6 & b7(C) provided a statement to S/A b6 & b7(C) that explained he was awoken at approximately 02:30 on December 16, 2013, by a State Park ranger and advised that everyone may need to evacuate due to the fire. b6 & b7(C) knew that b6 & b7(C) friend b6 & b7(C) was camped out above Lewald Flat and they went to warn him. b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) drove a half mile past the main park entrance and crossed the river and walked up to b6 & b7(C) camp. b6 & b7(C) was asleep in a dome tent when b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) arrived. b6 & b7(C) saw no signs of a fire ring, and the fire was not visible from the camp. b6 & b7(C) gathered two containers and a backpack of essentials. b6 & b7(C) crossed the river to walk back to her truck. b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) walked back towards Buzzards Roost and to Highway 1 to meet b6 & b7(C) because b6 & b7(C) did not want to cross the river. b6 & b7(C) drove them back to the dorm and made coffee. (EXHIBIT 11 b6 & b7(C) Written Statement)

S/A b6 & b7(C) and CALFIRE Investigator b6 & b7(C) interviewed b6 & b7(C) b6 & b7(C) of the b6 & b7(C) in Big Sur on December 16, 2013. b6 & b7(C) went to the Big Sur bridge in the vicinity of the fire activity across the street from the State Park lodge sometime between 03:00 and 06:00. b6 & b7(C) stated that he observed two white male adults come up from the river on to Highway 1. b6 & b7(C) stated one of the subjects was approximately 30 years old with a black ponytail and a beard. b6 & b7(C) stated that the second subject was in his fifties with no facial hair. b6 & b7(C) stated that the older subject told him that he was living in the woods in a tent, and that the fire was just going through it and he had to evacuate. b6 & b7(C) stated the older subject was rambling, and that he believed the older subject may have been intoxicated.



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b6 & b7(C) stated that the younger subject did not say anything. b6 & b7(C) stated that he did not see a car parked where the men came up from the river, and that he left as soon as he could. **(EXHIBIT 5 Supplemental Incident Report-Initial Response, S/A b6 & b7(C))**

Second Interview of b6 & b7(C)

On December 18, 2013, at approximately 09:30, S/A b6 & b7(C) and S/A b6 & b7(C) met b6 & b7(C) at his place of employment, the b6 & b7(C), and asked if he would be willing to take investigators to his camp site in the area of Buzzards Roost Trail and reenact events the night of the fire. b6 & b7(C) had a friendly and agreeable demeanor and stated he had no objections to assisting investigators in any way possible. b6 & b7(C) advised he was homeless, and had been camping illegally on state park land near the fire activity. b6 & b7(C) explained he was camped north of the Buzzards Roost Trail between Pfeiffer Ridge and CA Hwy 1. b6 & b7(C) advised his friend, b6 & b7(C), had woken him at approximately 03:00, on December 16th to warn him about the fire, and help him evacuate his personal belongings. b6 & b7(C) once again stated "locals" were harassing him/trying to scare him at night by following him and making noises near his tent at night. This statement was consistent with b6 & b7(C) previous conversation with SA b6 & b7(C) and FPT b6 & b7(C). b6 & b7(C) believed the group of "locals" was trying to scare him into leaving the area.

b6 & b7(C) took investigators to his camp site. The camp site was a significant distance north of the fire origin area. The camp site was approximately .25-.30 miles from the general origin area; it was completely burned over by low intensity fire. Fire vectors (angle of char, staining, protection and low intensity burning) indicate the fire backed through the area. Investigators observed no signs of fire emanating from the area. The campsite had a small fire ring, which had significant fire containment and debris clearance. The fire ring was cold and did not show evidence of fire escaping. b6 & b7(C) statements were consistent with his previous statements made to investigators and on site observations. b6 & b7(C) stated he did have a small camp fire on the night of December 15th but it was very small; made of sticks and twigs. He stated the fire was completely contained within the fire ring and completely extinguished with water prior to his going to bed that night. b6 & b7(C) showed S/A b6 & b7(C) the container he used to pour water on the fire and how he stirred it with a stick. The soil in the fire ring was cold and slightly damp, further corroborating his statements.

S/A b6 & b7(C) asked b6 & b7(C) if he knew and could describe the "locals" who were harassing him. b6 & b7(C) described four male, adult individuals: b6 & b7(C), b6 & b7(C), b6 & b7(C), and b6 & b7(C) (EXHIBIT 3-Origin



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and Cause Report, S/A [REDACTED]

Interviews of Men Living near Big Sur Post Office

On December 18, 2013, at approximately 13:30, S/A [REDACTED], USFS LEO [REDACTED], and National Park Service Ranger [REDACTED] tracked down four men that [REDACTED] claimed were harassing him. The men were known to frequent the area near the Big Sur Post Office and Deli. The officers spoke with [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED]. All of the men live in close proximity of Pfeiffer Ridge and Sycamore Canyon. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were sleeping in a [REDACTED] belonging to [REDACTED] on the night of the fire on [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] lives in a tent at [REDACTED] and was sleeping there the night of the fire. [REDACTED] was sleeping in his residence on Pfeiffer on the night of the fire; his home was burned in the fire. None of the men had any knowledge of the cause of the fire. (EXHIBIT 3-Origin and Cause Report, S/A [REDACTED])

Hikers Observed Leaving Bicycles at Big Sur Lodge

S/A [REDACTED] interviewed [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] on December 21, 2013, in the Big Sur Lodge parking lot. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were traveling together with a plan to bicycle as far as Panama, or until their money ran out. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] arrived in the Big Sur area on December 11, 2013, and stayed in the park December 11-12, 2013. On December 13, 2013, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] hiked to Sykes Hot Springs overnight and returned on December 14, 2013. On December 15, 2013, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] locked their bikes in front of the Big Sur Lodge because they thought it was a busy place and their bikes were less likely to be stolen there. The pair of men hiked towards Ventana Double Cone, but diverted because the trail was covered in snow. The pair then camped along the trail just past the Church Creek Divide. On December 16, 2013, the pair planned to return to Big Sur and observed thick black smoke, and found the canyon filled with grey smoke. The pair turned around and ultimately ended up at the Buddhist Center at Tassajara. The men then hitch hiked to Carmel on December 17, 2013. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] stayed in Carmel until December 21, 2013, when they took the local bus (Number 22) to the Big Sur Lodge. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] stated they did not have any information about how the Pfeiffer Fire started. (EXHIBIT 12 Memorandum of Interview, [REDACTED] December 21, 2013 & EXHIBIT 13 Memorandum of Interview, [REDACTED] December 21, 2013)



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Buzzards Roost Hiker

On December 22, 2013, S/A [b6 & b7(C)] contacted [b6 & b7(C)] by telephone regarding the Pfeiffer Fire in the Big Sur area. [b6 & b7(C)] is a United States Forest Service Fire Fighter and had reportedly hiked along the Buzzards Roost Trail below Pfeiffer Ridge on the day before the Pfeiffer Fire started. [b6 & b7(C)] told S/A [b6 & b7(C)] that he hiked on Buzzards Roost Trail on the afternoon of Thursday December 12, 2013. [b6 & b7(C)] stated that he encountered several people on the trail. He saw two hikers aged 55-60 hiking together, and saw a few more day hikers along the trail. None of the hikers had large packs. [b6 & b7(C)] stated he also saw [b6 & b7(C)] and some other workers from Blaze Construction working on a pipeline. (EXHIBIT 14 Memorandum of Interview, [b6 & b7(C)] December 22, 2013)

Alleged Facebook Posting about Cause of Fire

On December 17, 2013, CALFIRE Investigator [b6 & b7(C)] received information that [b6 & b7(C)], a server at [b6 & b7(C)] in Carmel, was overheard talking about a posting on her boyfriend's Facebook page stating that the Pfeiffer Fire started from a bar-b-que propane tank blowing up. A Monterey County Sheriff's Deputy spoke with [b6 & b7(C)] and she explained that she had not seen the posting, but her boyfriend [b6 & b7(C)] had seen it on a friend's page. (EXHIBIT 15 Email from Monterey County Sheriff's Deputy to CALFIRE Investigator, December 18, 2013)

S/A [b6 & b7(C)] made multiple attempts to speak with [b6 & b7(C)] boyfriend who was identified as [b6 & b7(C)] [b6 & b7(C)] between December 18, 2013 and December 22, 2013. On December 22, 2013, S/A [b6 & b7(C)] and S/A [b6 & b7(C)] made contact with [b6 & b7(C)] at his residence. [b6 & b7(C)] agreed to speak with the agents and told them that he had seen a Facebook posting from an old college friend [b6 & b7(C)]. [b6 & b7(C)] advised that the post had pictures of burning houses, and it had expressed sadness over the fire damage. [b6 & b7(C)] stated he had no knowledge of a Facebook posting regarding a bar-b-que blowing up and starting the fire. [b6 & b7(C)] advised that he was at home with his family on December 15, 2013. (EXHIBIT 16 Supplemental Incident Report, Interview of [b6 & b7(C)] December 22, 2013)

Summary

Interviews with first responders and other witnesses placed the suspected general origin area of the fire somewhere midslope below Pfeiffer Ridge near the Buzzard Roost Trail. Origin and Cause investigators



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determined the specific origin area was immediately adjacent to the water pipelines operated by the Pfeiffer Ridge Mutual Water Company and the Rancho Chaparral Mutual Water Company systems. Investigators found exposed electrical wires immediately adjacent to the water pipes; the pipe showed charring/discoloration and a rough texture, consistent with arcing, that directly corresponded to a specific point on an immediately adjacent wire where the insulation was charred and partially missing in sections.

b6 & b7(C) examined the mutual water systems as a whole and determined that a high resistance heating between the Pfeiffer Ridge Mutual Water Company control wire and the water line cannot be eliminated as the probable ignition scenario of the fire.

The cause of the fire was determined to be high resistance heating of the Pfeiffer Ridge Mutual Water Company electrical control wires immediately adjacent to a steel water pipe line. The high resistance heating of the electrical control wires created a competent ignition source for this fire. The first fuel ignited was accumulated dried leaves and redwood needles.

All other fire causes were considered, investigated, and evaluated during the investigation. All possible leads were followed, and all identified witnesses were interviewed.

NARRATIVE (Attach additional pages as necessary)

On December 21, 2013, at approximately 10:50, Special Agent (S/A) b6 & b7(C) met with United States Forest Service (USFS) Engine b6 & b7(C) b6 & b7(C) at the Big Sur Station to discuss the initial attack during the Pfeiffer Fire.

b6 & b7(C) recalled that Big Sur Volunteer Fire Department (BSVFD) b6 & b7(C) called him to advise him of the fire at approximately 00:10. b6 & b7(C) called USFS Battalion Chief (BC) b6 & b7(C) b6 & b7(C). Shortly thereafter, b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) drove north on Highway 1 from the Big Sur Station to a point just past the River Inn to scout and size up the fire. b6 & b7(C) believed he saw a glow from the Buzzard's Roost Trail area and thought it was low intensity backing fire. b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) then proceeded to assist BSVFD with the response as needed.

b6 & b7(C) recalled that b6 & b7(C) reported the fire was on both sides of Pfeiffer Ridge by 01:00.

b6 & b7(C) went up Pfeiffer Ridge road and observed the fire on both sides of Pfeiffer Ridge at approximately 01:30 and estimated flame lengths of 10-15 feet from the ground, winds 10-15 ENE. b6 & b7(C) estimated that winds along Highway 1 were 2-3 mph, gusting to 5 mph.

b6 & b7(C) recalled that the CALFIRE b6 & b7(C) CREW b6 & b7(C), supervised by CALFIRE b6 & b7(C) b6 & b7(C), was the first fire unit in the area of the pump house along the Big Sur River. CALFIRE Engines b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) supported the b6 & b7(C) CREW.

b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) continued to support and organize response to the fire through the night and remained assigned to the fire for its duration. END REPORT

16. REMARKS

On December 21, 2013, Special Agent (S/A) b6 & b7(C) met with b6 & b7(C) of the Big Sur Volunteer Fire Department (BSVFD) regarding the Pfeiffer Fire in the Big Sur area.

b6 & b7(C) advised that she had returned to her home at approximately 19:00, and gone to sleep at approximately 23:00. b6 & b7(C) received a fire page from the Monterey County Communication Center at approximately 23:47 that advised there was a fire at the Big Sur Lodge. b6 & b7(C) looked out her house and observed coming uphill towards her property, and that the fire was already crowning. b6 & b7(C) reported that the fire hit her caretaker's house with crowning fire, before overtaking her house.

b6 & b7(C) told S/A b6 & b7(C) that her caretaker b6 & b7(C) and two other men had walked her water pipeline from the top down to the river. They did this to check for water leaks, which they did. b6 & b7(C) advised that BLAZE Engineering had recently replaced the 200 feet of her water mutual pipeline from the pump, under the access trail and a short distance up hill. b6 & b7(C) believed BLAZE had done some work on Thursday and Friday, December 12-13, 2013, and that they wanted to come back the week of December 15th to replace an additional 100 feet of pipe. b6 & b7(C) said that BLAZE Engineering did most of the work on the water systems, and that b6 & b7(C) dealt with electrical issues. b6 & b7(C) said that her water mutual, Bridge Partners Water Mutual, had replace their electrical control system approximately 4 1/2 years before the fire.

b6 & b7(C) thought that Rancho Chaparral Water Mutual serves the bulk of the residences on Pfeiffer Ridge, and that they had replaced their piping about a month before the fire. END REPORT

NARRATIVE

On December 16, 2013, at approximately 05:30 Los Padres Forest Dispatch notified SA [b6 & b7(C)] about the Pfeiffer Fire on the Monterey Ranger District, Los Padres National Forest. SA [b6 & b7(C)] responded to the fire, arriving at the Incident Command Post at approximately 08:30.

SA [b6 & b7(C)] observed a white male adult, approximately 55 years of age walking up and down California Highway One in the vicinity of the Incident Command Post. The male subject had a blue backpack and a small multi colored tote bag. SA [b6 & b7(C)] believed the subject may be a transient in the area.

SA [b6 & b7(C)] met with Forest Prevention Technician [b6 & b7(C)] (FPT [b6 & b7(C)]) along the North Coast Ridge Road. The North Coast Ridge Road provided a vantage point to observe the entire east side, north, and south sides of the fire. The Pfeiffer Fire was walking in a southerly and westerly direction, and appeared to be mainly terrain driven at approximately 09:30. FPT [b6 & b7(C)] observations from his response to the fire made him suspect the general origin area may be located in the vicinity of the Buzzard's Roost trail between Pfeiffer Ridge and CA HWY 1.

SA [b6 & b7(C)] and FPT [b6 & b7(C)] again observed the suspected transient male subject sitting outside the Incident Command Post. SA [b6 & b7(C)] and FPT [b6 & b7(C)] made a consensual contact with the subject. The subject was identified as [b6 & b7(C)]. [b6 & b7(C)] advised that he was homeless, and had been camping illegally on state park land near the fire activity. [b6 & b7(C)] explained that he was camped north of the Buzzards Roost trail between Pfeiffer Ridge and CA HWY 1. [b6 & b7(C)] advised that a friend, [b6 & b7(C)], had woken him at approximately 03:00 to warn him about the fire, and help him evacuate his camp. [b6 & b7(C)] advised that he believed some local young people were harassing him, or trying to scare him at night by following him or making noises near his tent at night. [b6 & b7(C)] believed that the group of young people was trying to scare him into leaving the area. [b6 & b7(C)] claimed he recently got a job at [b6 & b7(C)] is an [b6 & b7(C)] that is popular with area visitors.

SA [b6 & b7(C)] and FPT [b6 & b7(C)] walked along the Big Sur River to the Buzzards Roost trail. SA [b6 & b7(C)] observed the fire backing slowly downhill towards the river trail, and making advancing runs through brush and redwoods. The Buzzards Roost trail became impassable due to the fire activity. SA [b6 & b7(C)] observed ground litter and smaller trees turning white hot from the fire.

SA [b6 & b7(C)] and FPT [b6 & b7(C)] taped off the access to the Buzzards Roost trail near the intersection of the state parks connector trail coming from the Pfeiffer Big Sur State Park Campground and the river trail.

SA [b6 & b7(C)] met with Calfire Investigator [b6 & b7(C)], SA [b6 & b7(C)] and Investigator [b6 & b7(C)] interviewed [b6 & b7(C)] and [b6 & b7(C)]. [b6 & b7(C)] is a [b6 & b7(C)] employed at the Pfeiffer Big Sur Campground. [b6 & b7(C)] was friends with [b6 & b7(C)] knew that [b6 & b7(C)] was camped below Pfeiffer Ridge. [b6 & b7(C)] and [b6 & b7(C)] went to go rouse [b6 & b7(C)] and help him evacuate his illegal campsite.

SA [b6 & b7(C)] and Investigator [b6 & b7(C)] interviewed [b6 & b7(C)] of the Fernwood Resort, in Big Sur. [b6 & b7(C)] went to the Big Sur bridge in the vicinity of the fire activity across the street from the State Park lodge sometime between 0300 and 0600. [b6 & b7(C)] stated that he observed two white male adults come up from the river on to CA HWY 1. [b6 & b7(C)] stated one of the subjects was approximately 30 years old with a black ponytail and a beard. [b6 & b7(C)] stated that the second subject was in his fifties with no facial hair. [b6 & b7(C)] stated that the older subject told him that he was living in the woods in a tent, and that the fire was just going through it and he had to evacuate. [b6 & b7(C)] stated the older subject was rambling, and that he believed the older subject may have been intoxicated. [b6 & b7(C)] stated that the younger subject did not say anything. [b6 & b7(C)] stated that he did not see a car

parked where the men came up from the river, and that he left as soon as he could.

LEO **b6 & b7(C)** advised SA **b6 & b7(C)** that she contacted a known registered sex offender near the access to the fire at approximately 15:00. LEO **b6 & b7(C)** advised that she knew the subject from previous contacts. The subject became combative and sheriff's deputies assisted LEO **b6 & b7(C)** with the contact. While SA **b6 & b7(C)** was speaking with **b6 & b7(C)**, he mentioned seeing a van matching the description of the registered sex offender when he went to look at the fire between 03:00 and 06:00. **b6 & b7(C)** stated that he saw the side doors of the van were opened and an individual inside was watching the fire.

As of 19:00 on December 16, 2013, incident management estimated the fire size at approximately 500 acres. Officials also estimated the possible loss of twenty to thirty homes.

Investigation of this incident continues.

On December 19, 2013, at approximately 12:00 b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) came to meet with members of the Pfeiffer Fire investigative team at the Los Padres NF Big Sur Fire Station. LEO b6 & b7(C) had asked b6 & b7(C) to meet with the team to discuss the water piping system along the Big Sur River that serves several residences along Pfeiffer Ridge Road.

The following personnel were present SA b6 & b7(C), LEO b6 & b7(C), LEO b6 & b7(C) and FPT b6 & b7(C).

b6 & b7(C) began the conversation by asking when Pacific Gas & Electric Company (PG&E) could enter the fire investigation scene to restring electrical power lines that had gone down the day after the fire. b6 & b7(C) explained that they would like to restore water services to those properties serviced by the system he helps operate.

SA b6 & b7(C) asked b6 & b7(C) to explain how the system worked and the contents of the exposed steel pipes at the base of the slope running up to Pfeiffer Ridge. b6 & b7(C) explained that b6 & b7(C) could explain the system in more detail than he could, and that is why he had brought him to meet with the team.

b6 & b7(C) explained that the system is fed by four pumps feeding four separate water lines that ascended the slope onto the ridge. b6 & b7(C) explained that the PG&E power line provided power to the four pumps, and the four pumps drove the water through the pipes to storage tanks along the ridge. SA b6 & b7(C) asked if there was any electrical wire in the pipes. b6 & b7(C) explained there was no wire inside the water mutual's pipes. b6 & b7(C) later stated that the storage tanks have electrical float switches which would signal each pump to stop pumping water to the tank.

SA b6 & b7(C) asked b6 & b7(C) where the wires went and what type of wires signaled the pumps. b6 & b7(C) stated they led back down to the pumps. b6 & b7(C) stated that the electrical wire was "romex" and that it was located on the outside of the pipes. b6 & b7(C) stated that it was something that should be changed.

SA b6 & b7(C) explained to b6 & b7(C) that the team was unaware of the electrical wire on the exterior wires, and may now need to have experts look at the electrical wires. SA b6 & b7(C) contacted an electrical engineer and officially requested they be ordered through the Pfeiffer incident command ordering system the same day for the purpose of assisting the investigation. END REPORT

On December 21, 2013, at approximately 12:15 [b6 & b7(C)], [b6 & b7(C)] and [b6 & b7(C)] [b6 & b7(C)] came to meet with members of the Pfeiffer Fire investigative team at the Rancho Chaparral Water Mutual Company pump house along the Big Sur River. The men are all associated with the Rancho Chaparral Water Mutual Company or Blaze Engineering.

The following personnel were present SA [b6 & b7(C)], SA [b6 & b7(C)], and [b6 & b7(C)].

[b6 & b7(C)] and [b6 & b7(C)] unlocked the pump house and showed [b6 & b7(C)] the Rancho Chaparral pump system, and electrical panel. [b6 & b7(C)] provided information to [b6 & b7(C)] about the Rancho Chaparral electrical system. The pump pumps water up to storage tanks on Pfeiffer Ridge. The tanks have electrical float switches. When the float is triggered by rising or lowering water an electrical charge runs through a romex electrical line to the electrical panel along the Big Sur River. The romex electrical line runs along the outside of the pipeline.

The two other pipeline systems operated by other water mutual operate in a similar manner. The other water mutual companies are the Bridge Partners Water Mutual and the Lower Pfeiffer Water Mutual.

[b6 & b7(C)] advised that Blaze Engineering had replaced 200 feet of water pipeline for Bridge Partners on December 12-13, 2013. The project required excavation of the river trail to replace the pipeline section.

Bridge Partners pipeline is located south of the pump house. Rancho Chaparral's and Lower Pfeiffer's pipelines begin running uphill north of the pump house. The pipelines for both mutual run uphill immediately adjacent to one another. END REPORT



CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE SPECIFICATIONS

1. This permit gives permission to occupy a U.S. Forest Service water line easement within the Pfeiffer Ridge Road. If the Forest Service or its assigns requires a water line over this easement in the future, then the permittee agrees to share the easement area.
2. The pipeline will be buried on the inside of the road at least 36 inches, and out of sight in all other locations. Approved signs marking the location of the pipeline will be placed where directed by the District Ranger.
3. A centerline survey and plat of the pipeline will be submitted to the District Ranger within 12 months of the date of this permit. The survey will show ties to property corners and the existing water pipeline and telephone cable.
4. No excavations shall be made in the existing Pfeiffer Ridge Road without prior approval of the District Ranger. Trenches shall be refilled to the existing road grade and material compacted to match existing compaction on the road.
5. The Pfeiffer Ridge Road shall be kept open during construction and maintenance of the pipeline.
6. This permit is subject to the Special-Use Permit for road dated 6/18/65, granted to the Department of Parks and Recreation, Pfeiffer-Big Sur State Park. All pipeline construction and maintenance activity within the Pfeiffer Ridge Road shall be coordinated with the Park Superintendent.

FIRE PLAN

Water Supply

These provisions outline the responsibility for fire prevention and suppression activities within the permit area.

1. Burning, Blasting, or Welding

A permit is required for these activities and must be obtained from the District Ranger.

2. Spark Arresters

All stationary or mobile internal combustion engines used in the permittee's operation shall be provided with an adequate spark arrester. Such spark arresters shall meet Forest Service standards, and be adequately maintained. Motor trucks, buses, and passenger vehicles, except motorcycles, are not subject to the provisions of this paragraph provided the exhaust system is equipped with a muffler.

3. Smoking

Smoking will not be permitted during the fire season, except as may be permitted by and under such conditions stated by the Forest Service. Smoking will not be permitted while operating tractors, graders, or similar equipment, nor while working or walking in the area. If desired by the permittee, he may clear or otherwise prepare safe smoking areas if such areas meet the approval of the Forest Service.

4. Open Fires

Open fires will not be permitted at any time.

5. Fire Suppression

All fires within the area shall be immediately reported to the Forest Service. The permittee will make every effort to suppress any fires until help arrives.

6. Fire Closure

If the permit area is within the fire closure, an entry permit must be obtained from the District Ranger.

7. Emergency Measures

During extreme fire weather all construction and/or maintenance activity may be curtailed or shut down for short periods due to extreme fire danger.

18. Arsenicals, nitro glycerine, high explosives, and blasting caps or other non-aerial explosives in the Forest Service or in the permit area shall not be used in the Forest Service nor the Government's jurisdiction. While these substances cannot be removed, they present a risk to permittees's improvements and personnel which the permittee hereby accepts. The permittee has the responsibility of inspecting the area under this permit and the immediate adjoining area for dangerous areas, hanging limbs and other evidence of hazardous conditions and securing permission from the Forest Service to remove such hazards.

19. If payment of the special use fee has not been made within 75 days of the date of issuance of the first request for payment, a service charge in addition to the regular fee will be made for late payment of the fee. The service charge will be 1% per month of the unpaid balance, with a \$25.00 minimum charge. Your permit is subject to termination for continued non-payment of the fee.

20. A service fee will be charged for issuance of a new permit as the result of any change of ownership other than enforcement of contract, foreclosure, tax sale, or other valid legal proceedings against the improvements occupying this area.

21. If, during excavation work, items of substantial archeological or paleontological value are discovered, or a known deposit of such items is disturbed, the permittee will cease excavation in the area so affected. He will then notify the District Ranger and will not resume excavation until written approval is given by the District Ranger.

22. This permit is issued with the express understanding of the parties hereto that, notwithstanding any other provision of this permit, the Forest Service may amend this permit, or amend it to limit the quantity and/or manner of waste diversions by the permittee, if in the future the Forest Service determines that the value derived by the permittee should be devoted to other National Forest purposes, and no compensation shall be paid to permittee for such amendment or amendment, or for loss of water.

23. The permittee shall handle all work with explosives in such a manner as not to endanger life or property. All storage places for explosives and inflammable material shall be marked accordingly. The method of storing and handling explosives and inflammable materials shall conform with all federal, state, and local laws, by-laws, and regulations.

24. The permittee shall join the Forest Service in preparing a fire plan which shall set forth in detail the plan for prevention, control, and suppression of fires on and in the vicinity of the permitted area. For the purposes of this plan the vicinity boundary shall be 300 feet from any improvements.

25. The permittee agrees to permit unrestricted access to and upon the premises at all times for all lawful and proper purposes not inconsistent with the intent of the permit or with the reasonable exercise and enjoyment by the permittee of the privileges thereof.

26. This permit supersedes the special use permit issued to John W. McCord on September 13, 1962.

FIRE PLAN

1. The permittee shall employ or designate some competent employee as "Fire Warden" for the area during such periods of construction or use, as may be required by the Forest Supervisor, and shall notify the District Ranger in writing, the name of the designated "Fire Warden" to be contacted on fire protection and suppression matters. This man shall represent the permittee in all matters pertaining to fire prevention and fire suppression on the area; his primary activity will be to supervise and enforce all the fire prevention and suppression measures outlined in this permit.
2. All possible cooperation shall be given the Forest Service in the prevention of fire and the permittee or employee of the permittee shall refrain from smoking on the area except at places of habitation or at places designated and posted by the District Ranger.
3. As a protection against escape of fire, the permittee shall equip all steam-powered equipment and all gasoline and diesel shovels, tractors, and other internal combustion engines used with spark arresters kept in constant use and repair, and satisfactory to the Forest Supervisor. Each tractor and truck shall be equipped with one shovel, one axe, and a fire extinguisher of not less than $1\frac{1}{2}$ quart capacity, and each steam rig or gasoline or diesel shovel shall be equipped with six shovels, three axes, and three pack pumps. All fire tools and equipment shall be kept in good condition and available for instant use.
4. All explosives used in construction shall be discharged with an electric detonator. Materials of an explosive or inflammable nature shall be stored and handled in a safe manner satisfactory to the District Ranger.
5. Any welding shall be performed under a welding permit secured from the District Ranger.
6. In the event of fire, the permittee shall allow the Forest Service or other cooperative fire-fighting agency to draw on any or all existing water lines and reservoirs for water to be used for filling fire trucks or pumping for actual fire-fighting purposes.
7. During the period of construction and use a cache of fire tools as required by the District Ranger and consisting of axes, shovels, or McLeod tools shall be kept in a sealed box at a central, readily accessible location in the area.
8. Before construction is started, the areas to be occupied shall be cleared of all dead brush and other debris, and thereafter such debris must be cleared and the area cleaned up annually before the opening of the fire season. Space shall be cleared surrounding toilets, outhouses, garbage pits, and all other structures and facilities adequate to prevent the spread of fire from them.
9. All trash and debris shall be collected currently and disposed of in such manner as stipulated by the District Ranger.
10. No burning of debris or otherwise without first acquiring a permit from the District Ranger.

16. REMARKS

SYNOPSIS:

b6 & b7(C) summarized that he and his friend, b6 & b7(C) left in the morning of December 15, 2013 to go hiking towards Vantana Double Cone. When they tried to head back to Big Sur on December 16, 2013, they saw smoke in the canyon and, not knowing where the fire was, decided to egress the area via Tassajara Road. They went to Carmel, CA and stayed there a few days, returning to the Big Sur Lodge on December 21, 2013.

DETAILS:

On December 21, 2013, Special Agent (SA) b6 & b7(C) U.S. Forest Service (USFS), interviewed b6 & b7(C) in the parking lot of Big Sur Lodge, located on the grounds of the Pfeiffer Big Sur State Park. The interview was related to the Pfeiffer Fire investigation. The identity of the interviewing agent was made known to b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) consented to being interviewed. b6 & b7(C) provided the following information.

On Sunday, December 15, 2013 at about 0900 hours, b6 & b7(C) and his friend, b6 & b7(C) left their bicycles at Big Sur Lodge locked at the bike rack. They departed on foot for a two night trip to the Vantana Double Cone area from the trail head located at Big Sur Station. Their plans were to return on Tuesday, December 17, 2013.

b6 & b7(C) stated that they decided to lock their bicycles at the Big Sur Lodge since the area appeared to be well travelled and less likely for the bikes to be stolen. Also, b6 & b7(C) explained that they had stayed several nights at the Hiker/Biker Camp at Pfeiffer Big Sur State Park and was familiar with the area.

While hiking to Vantana Double Cone, the trail reportedly became unpassable due to snow and dead trees that had fallen. They diverted their plans to Pine Ridge Trail to Church Creek Divide

Camp and camped along the trail just past Church Creek Divide Camp. b6 & b7(C) estimated that they hiked about nine hours on December 15, 2013 before setting up camp.

On Monday, December 16, 2013, b6 & b7(C) reported that they started to hike back towards Big Sur after having breakfast. About one hour into their hike, they reportedly saw thick black smoke in the distance. As they hiked into a canyon, they found the canyon was filled with thin grey smoke. Becoming alarmed and concerned about a fire along their route back to Big Sur, they decided to head east towards Tassajara Road. They hiked through China Camp and ultimately to Tassajara Road. They traveled down Tassajara Road to the Buddhist monastery, where they used the monestary's satellite phone to call for information about the fire. b6 & b7(C) reported that they were told that it was safe for them to hike towards Big Sur by the information line.

b6 & b7(C) said that they did not feel comfortable hiking towards the fire, despite the information from the information line. b6 & b7(C) reported that they hiked to County Road G-16 and hitch hiked back to Carmel, CA, arriving on Tuesday night (December 17, 2013). They waited in Carmel until Saturday, December 21, 2013 and caught the local municipal bus (Number 22) to Big Sur Lodge. b6 & b7(C) said that the 22 Bus only runs on weekends.

b6 & b7(C) summarized that he and his friend, b6 & b7(C) left in the morning of December 15, 2013 to go hiking towards Vantana Double Cone. When they tried to head back to Big Sur on December 16, 2013, they saw smoke in the canyon and, not knowing where the fire was, decided to egress the area via Tassajara Road. They went to Carmel, CA and stayed there a few days, returning to the Big Sur Lodge on December 21, 2013. They have no information about the start of the fire.

DETAILS:

On December 21, 2013, Special Agent (SA) b6 & b7(C) U.S. Forest Service (USFS), interviewed b6 & b7(C) in the parking lot of Big Sur Lodge, located on the grounds of the Pfeiffer Big Sur State Park. The interview was related to the Pfeiffer Fire investigation. The identity of the interviewing agent was made known to b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) consented to being interviewed. b6 & b7(C) provided the following information.

b6 & b7(C) stated that he and b6 & b7(C) were on a biking trip from the Yukon, along the west coast, with an ultimate destination of Panama. Once in Panama, b6 & b7(C) is considering proceeding to New Zealand. However, where b6 & b7(C) decides to turnaround for home at is dependent on when his money runs out. b6 & b7(C) said that he and b6 & b7(C) had met while working as tree planters in Canada.

b6 & b7(C) stated that he and b6 & b7(C) arrived in the Big Sur area on December 11, 2013. They reportedly biked from the Carmel area to Pfeiffer Big Sur State Park. They stayed overnight at Pfeiffer Big Sur State Park on December 11 and 12, 2013. On December 13, 2013, b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) reportedly went for an overnight trip to Sykes, where there is a hot spring. They returned to Big Sur Lodge at Pfeiffer Big Sur State Park on December 14, 2013. On the night of December

14, 2013, b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) reportedly saw a band play in the town of Big Sur and overnighted in Pfeiffer Big Sur State Park.

On the morning of December 15, 2013, b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) locked their bikes at the Big Sur Lodge and proceeded to hike to Vantana Double Cone. b6 & b7(C) stated that they believed Big Sur Lodge was a busy place and would deter their bikes from getting stolen so they locked their bikes up at the lodge.

b6 & b7(C) stated that they started their hike at the Pine Ridge Trail, located at Big Sur Station. They went to Sykes and had lunch there. They then proceeded towards Vantana Double Cone but were unable to find the Bear Basin Trail. So, they diverted to Church Creek Divide Camp and camped in the area just past the campground.

On December 16, 2013, after realizing that they would not be able to get to Vantana Double Cone, b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) started to hike back to Big Sur. b6 & b7(C) recalled seeing smoke laying down in a canyon about three to four miles east of Redwood Camp. b6 & b7(C) stated that they turned around and went on the Pine Ridge Trail to China Camp and continued to Tassajara Road. After reaching Tassajara Road, b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) went south, past Wild Cat Campsite, and spent the night by the Tassajara Zen Mountain Center.

On December 17, 2013, b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) went to the Zen Center, where they got information about the fire. They then hiked north on Tassajara Road towards China Camp. They then went to the observatory, where they got a ride from the observatory's caretaker. They got a ride to about five miles before County Road G-16, where they hiked the rest of the way to County Road G-16. They then hitch hiked a ride to Carmel on County Road G-16.

Between December 17 and 21, 2013, b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) were in Carmel mostly sleeping on the streets. On December 21, 2013, b6 & b7(C) and b6 & b7(C) reportedly caught Municipal Bus #22 from Carmel back to Big Sur Lodge.

b6 & b7(C) stated that he had no information about how the Pfeiffer Fire started.

The interview concluded at approximately 1250 hours.

The information received was she saw a posting on her boyfriend's page regarding how the fire started.

Dep. b6 & b7(C) called b6 & b7(C) and spoke to an unknown subject, possibly b6 & b7(C). He explained the situation and was given a telephone for b6 & b7(C) to call. He was also told b6 & b7(C) boyfriend was a subject named b6 & b7(C). I recall the number was a 530 area code. I know from my training and experience the 530 area code is used in the Chico and Redding areas of Northern California.

Dep. b6 & b7(C) called b6 & b7(C) at the number provided by b6 & b7(C) he spoke to b6 & b7(C) and she told him her last name was b6 & b7(C). She provided the birth date of b6 & b7(C). She told Dep. b6 & b7(C) she didn't see the posting, but her boyfriend had seen it on a friend's page. I logged on to facebook.com and conducted a search of the name b6 & b7(C). I was not able to locate a match that I believed was the subject Dep. b6 & b7(C) contacted based on the information we had. I later conducted a records check of the name b6 & b7(C) (DOB b6 & b7(C)). I found there was a subject named b6 & b7(C) b6 & b7(C) with the same date of birth with and address in Pacific Grove. See attached DMV record.

I checked the name b6 & b7(C) on facebook.com I found the following profile:

SYNOPSIS:

On December 22, 2013, efforts were taken to locate and interview [b6 & b7(C)]. [b6 & b7(C)] was previously identified as possibly having information related to a friend's FaceBook post regarding how the Pfeiffer Fire started. [b6 & b7(C)] was found to be the registered owner of a Blue Chevrolet Suburban, (CA) [b6 & b7(C)] and the driver of a White body with Green tailgate Ford Truck, (CA) [b6 & b7(C)].

DETAILS:

[b6 & b7(C)] was identified by a Cal Fire investigator for a possible interview. [b6 & b7(C)] was identified by a third party as possibly having knowledge or knowing someone who has knowledge on how the Pfeiffer Fire started.

On December 22, 2013, Special Agent (SA) [b6 & b7(C)], U.S. Forest Service (USFS), and SA [b6 & b7(C)] [b6 & b7(C)] USFS, attempted to locate and interview [b6 & b7(C)] as his residence, [b6 & b7(C)] Pacific Grove, CA. Upon arriving at the address, a blue Chevrolet Suburban, (CA) [b6 & b7(C)] was found parked in the street immediately in front of the residence. Parked behind the blue Chevrolet Suburban was a maroon Dodge Dakota truck, (CA) [b6 & b7(C)].

(CA) [b6 & b7(C)] was queried through the Angeles National Forest (ANF) Emergency Communications Center (ECC) and found to be registered to [b6 & b7(C)] [b6 & b7(C)] Pacific Grove, CA.

(CA) [b6 & b7(C)] was queried through the ANF ECC and found to be registered to [b6 & b7(C)] [b6 & b7(C)] [b6 & b7(C)] Pacific Grove, CA.

At approximately 0925 hours, SA [b6 & b7(C)] and SA [b6 & b7(C)] attempted to locate [b6 & b7(C)] at his residence, [b6 & b7(C)] Pacific Grove, CA. The door was answered by his mother, to whom SA [b6 & b7(C)] identified himself as a law enforcement officer and asked if [b6 & b7(C)] was at home. [b6 & b7(C)] mother stated that he was at home in bed. Subsequently, a person known to investigating officers as [b6 & b7(C)] girlfriend appeared. Again, SA [b6 & b7(C)] identified himself as law enforcement and explained to [b6 & b7(C)]s girlfriend the purpose of the visit.

At approximately 0930 hours, [b6 & b7(C)] emerged from the residence and was interviewed in the driveway. Summarily, [b6 & b7(C)] stated that he had seen a FaceBook post from [b6 & b7(C)] an old college friend, regarding the Pfeiffer Fire. Specifically, [b6 & b7(C)] described the post as having pictures of burning houses and expressing a sentiment of sadness over the fire damage. [b6 & b7(C)] denied knowing anything about any posts regarding the fire starting when a bar-b-que blew up. [b6 & b7(C)] stated that he was at home with family and watched football at home on December 15, 2013. [b6 & b7(C)] stated he had not been to Big Sur for months. [b6 & b7(C)] reportedly went to work on Monday, December 16, 2013.

While departing the residence, [b6 & b7(C)] stated that he drove the Ford truck for work. The truck was perpendicular parked in the cul-de-sac adjacent to his residence. The body of the truck was white and the tailgate was green. It displayed California License Plate [b6 & b7(C)].
