The Pleasant Grove and Spanish Fork Ranger Districts, of the Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest are currently recruiting applicants for the 2015 field season. Most of these positions work from mid-May to mid-August. This year's hiring time frame will begin earlier than previous years with job announcements flying from early December to late January. Applications will need to be submitted through USA Jobs <https://www.usajobs.gov> to be considered during the initial hiring process for 2015.

The job announcement numbers/titles have been provided for most positions. Typically jobs are open for applications for a one week period. If the date for when the jobs will be open is not indicated, please check with district staff to see when the jobs will be open for applications. Please check <http://www.fs.usda.gov/uwcnf> for a list of JOA numbers that will be filled in 2015, along with other hiring information including instructions on applying for a job using USA Jobs (Located under Quick Links, Employment Opportunities).

Please keep the following in mind when filling out your profile in USA Jobs:

- Ensure that you select the duty station(s) you are interested in (Duty stations for the Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest include: Logan, Ogden, Salt Lake City, Pleasant Grove, Spanish Fork, Heber, Kamas, Evanston Wyoming and Mountain View Wyoming). (There are many other duty stations nationwide that may have available positions).
- To be as competitive as possible please include *thorough* details of your work experience and other transferable skills. Examples of transferrable skills for some seasonal positions may include things like tool use, working with customers, farm work, landscaping, driving four wheel drive vehicles etc. Be detailed, ensure that the information supplied is valuable, and do not use filler text.
- Attach college transcripts, DD Form 214 (Veterans), and any other applicable documentation to your profile.
- Keep any email confirmations that your application was successful.

Working as a seasonal is a great way to learn more about the National Forest Service, develop valuable work skills, and begin developing a career working for a land management agency. Working outdoors with highly motivated employees, who share a passion for managing public lands is a great way to spend a summer, a few years or an entire career.
