FOREST ORDER

Being on a trail and road for public health and safety

Pursuant to Title 36 CFR Part 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited within the area described below and in attached Exhibit A – Location Area Map, on the Umpqua National Forest. This order is effective December 8th, 2014 until April 30th, 2015 unless sooner rescinded.

Motorized vehicles (snowmobiles) are prohibited as described below:

Mt. Bailey Description:

The area is described as no snowmobiling to the left of the ascent road to the false summit of Mt. Bailey and to the north of the East Ridge which divides the Northeast Face from the Avalanche Bowl.

Pursuant to Title 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

- 1) Any Federal, State or local Officer or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
- 2) Owners or lessees of land in the area.


These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in Title 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.


