## 2015 Temporary Recreation, Vegetation and Aquatic Positions



### Outreach Announcement for GS-3/GS-4/GS-5/GS-6

The Mt. Baker-Snoqualmie National Forest will soon begin filling multiple temporary seasonal GS-3, GS-4, GS-5, and GS-6 recreation, trail and wilderness, vegetation, and aquatic positions for 2015. These are **SEASONAL TEMPORARY** positions with a maximum six month tour schedule (NTE 1039 hours). The anticipated start date for these positions varies from the end of April to early June, 2015. Employees who are students generally work through the end of August, while others may work as late as November. Virtually all of the positions require physical exertion in rough terrain. The work is performed outdoors in all weather conditions including summer heat, rain and snow. Housing may be available at duty stations.

**Recreation:** Developed recreation crews maintains campgrounds, trailhead and dispersed recreation sites. Duties include removing litter, cleaning bathrooms, repairing existing facilities, contacting members of the public, and collecting data pertinent to recreation use. Work is performed in all weather conditions.

**Trail and Wilderness:** Trail crews maintain hiking trails on the Forest. Work includes cutting and removing trees that have fallen across trails, providing proper drainage on trails and picnic areas, regular repairing trails, removing brush, and other manual labor. Wilderness Rangers perform a variety of duties including contacting the public to provide information on wilderness philosophy and regulations, gathers data on wilderness conditions, and safety checks of wilderness camping areas. Positions will work in all weather conditions, hike long distances, carry loads exceeding 25 pounds (including tools), and spend multiple days at a time in the backcountry.

**Vegetation:** These positions perform timber presale duties including timber marking, traversing harvest units, cutting unit boundaries, and basic tree measurements. Hiking long distances to remote areas should be expected. Expect to conduct work under arduous (wet) weather and terrain conditions.

**Aquatics:** These positions conduct field surveys under arduous (wet) weather and terrain conditions. Hiking long distances to remote areas should be expected as well as carrying loads exceeding 25 pounds. Habitat surveys, electrofishing, and macroinvertebrate collections are regularly conducted by wading through streams, ponds, and lakes. The technicians will also conduct road, culvert, and timber sale area surveys. The Mt. Baker Snoqualmie National Forest is blessed with all five species of pacific salmon, summer and winter steelhead, anadromous bull and cutthroat trout as well as resident trout.

Region 6 National Forests (Oregon and Washington) will be opening vacancy announcements in USAJOBS for the GS-3, 4, 5, and 6 vacancies in these programs. The Announcements will be open from **January 6<sup>th</sup> to January 12<sup>th</sup>**. ***You will only be able to apply to these announcements during those dates.***

**Follow these directions to apply:**

1. Go to <https://my.usajobs.gov/>
2. If you are a first time user you will have to create a profile; if not, login using your current USAJobs login information. Skip to number 4 if you have already created a profile and resume.
3. Click on: RESUME. Enter your information to build a resume or up-load your own.
4. After your resume is ready, you can apply for jobs. Click on "Search Jobs". Search for the GS-3/GS-4/GS-5/GS-6 announcement by inputting the desired duty location into the Location box. You can also search for a specific position by inputting the ***exact*** announcement number listed below into the search window.
5. Select the GS-3, GS-4, GS-5, GS-6 temporary seasonal position of your choice from the list of positions.
6. Make sure the Announcement number is **EXACT** and you've chosen the correct duty station.
7. Click the "Apply online" button, and follow the steps to complete the online application, being sure to read each question carefully and answering completely.
8. Submit your application and check back from the home page under "Application Status".
