**Directions**  
From I-75 exit 25, take US 25 west for 5 miles. Turn right on KY 1193 and go 2 miles. Turn right on Forest Service Road 558. From the Grove Boat Ramp, boat 1 mile north to the boat-in campground.

**Boat Ramps**  
Ramps at Grove, High Top and Flatwoods. Moorings to access tent sites.



Service road is closed to vehicles.



Consumption of alcohol and open containers of alcohol are prohibited.




No swimming or fishing at boat ramps.

Grove Boat-In Campground, located on London Ranger District, is accessible by boat from Laurel River Lake or by trail from Grove Campground. The campground sits at the end of two peninsulas separated by a small bay. Most campsites are near the water's edge with boat moorings near each site. The sites are spaced apart and provide a sense of seclusion. Each site has a tent pad, fire ring, picnic table, and lantern poles. Self-serve pay stations, water, and vault toilets are centrally located. There are no flush toilets or showers.

Grove Marina is a full-service marina located within 1/2-mile of the campground. The marina is privately owned and operated under a special-use permit with the Forest Service.

**FOOD STORAGE REQUIRED.** Visitors in developed sites must store food, garbage and other odorous items that may attract bears in a bear-resistant container, inside their vehicle, or in an enclosed hard-body trailer. Backcountry campers must suspend food, garbage and odorous items at least 10 feet off the ground and four feet away from any tree or pole. All food leftovers and trash must be properly disposed of in a bear-resistant trash receptacle or other container where provided by the Forest Service.
