Location
From I-75, exit 38, travel west on KY 192. Go 24.5 miles to Old Whitney Road on the left. Follow signs to campground. From Somerset, travel east on KY 192 for 21 miles. Turn right onto Old Whitney Road. Follow signs to campground.



Parking
At campground. Do not block access to the gates.



Open Dates
Open all year.



Fees
None.



Campsites
4 single, 2 double. Sites available on a first-come, first-served basis. 14 day limit.



Trash Pickup
None. Pack out your trash.



Restrooms
Chemical toilets, available seasonally.



Accessibility
Sites do not meet accessibility standards for persons with disabilities.

Little Lick Horse Camp on London Ranger District is a favorite destination for campers who also enjoy horseback riding on Little Lick Trail #502 and Nathan McClure Trail #530. The campground is located on a long ridgetop in the southeast corner of Pulaski County, Kentucky, just north of the Cumberland River.

Little Lick Campground provides four family camping areas and two double campsites. The campsites have tent pads, fire rings, lantern posts and picnic tables. The well with a hand pump is for livestock watering only. You will need to bring your own drinking water, and plan on packing out your trash.

Negative Coggins Test Required. The Kentucky Department of Agriculture requires a negative Coggins or similar test for equine infectious anemia and a valid certificate of veterinary inspection.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

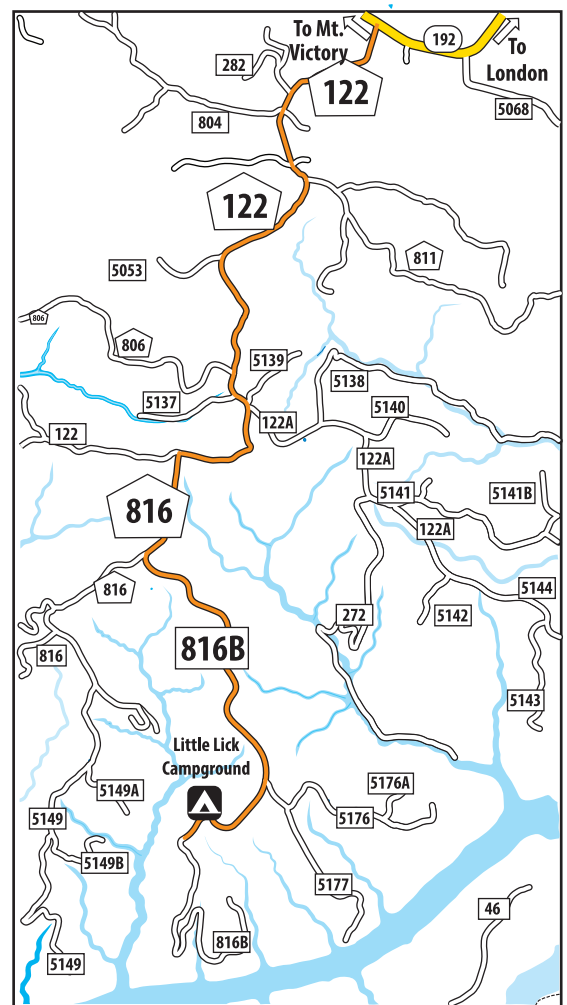
- Your campsite must be occupied during the first 24 hours.
- Do not hang garbage from lantern posts.
- Park on pavement only, not on grass or roadside.
- Campground speed limit is 10 MPH.

FOOD STORAGE REQUIRED



Put food, trash and other odorous items in a bear-resistant container or hang from a tree.

Store food and trash in a closed motor vehicle with a solid top or a closed hard-body trailer.
