Location
From I-75, exit 38, travel west on KY 192. Go 24.5 miles to Old Whitney Road on the left. Follow signs to the campground. From Somerset, travel east on KY 192 for 21 miles. Turn right onto Old Whitney Road. Follow signs to the campground.



Parking
At campground. Do not block access to the gates.

Open all year.

Campsites
4 single, 2 double. Sites available on a first-come, first-served basis. 14 day limit.



Trash Pickup
None. Pack out your trash.



Restrooms
Pit toilets



Accessibility
Sites do not meet accessibility standards for persons with disabilities.



Trails are closed to motorized vehicles.



Consumption of alcohol and open containers of alcohol are prohibited.



Do not tie horses to the trees. Use picket lines and corrals to secure horses.

Little Lick Horse Camp on London Ranger District is a favorite destination for campers who also enjoy horseback riding on Little Lick Trail #502 and Nathan McClure Trail #530. The campground is located on a long ridgetop in the southeast corner of Pulaski County, Kentucky, just north of the Cumberland River.

The Little Lick Campground provides four family camping areas and two double campsites. The campsites have tent pads, fire rings, lantern posts and picnic tables. The well with a hand pump is for livestock watering only.




CAUTION: Low lying areas are prone to flooding, so be alert for flooding when driving, camping or crossing streams in this area. Swift currents and undertows can make swimming and wading very hazardous.



FOOD STORAGE REQUIRED.

Visitors in developed sites must store food, garbage and other odorous items that may attract bears in a bear-resistant container, inside their vehicle, or in an enclosed hard-body trailer. Backcountry campers must suspend food, garbage and odorous items at least 10 feet off the ground and four feet away from any tree or pole. All food leftovers and trash must be properly disposed of in a bear-resistant trash receptacle or other container where provided by the Forest Service.




