Sugar Tree Hollow Trail #407


Sugar Tree Hollow Trail is a 1.5-mile loop trail that begins and ends at the Bald Rock Picnic Area. A spur trail (#407A) leads downhill for about a quarter-mile before intersecting with Cane Creek Trail #410.

FOOD STORAGE REQUIRED.

Visitors in developed sites must store food, garbage and other odorous items that may attract bears in a bear-resistant container, inside their vehicle, or in an enclosed hard-body trailer.


Backcountry campers must suspend food, garbage and odorous items at least 10 feet off the ground and four feet away from any tree or pole. All food leftovers and trash must be properly disposed of in a bear-resistant trash receptacle or other container where provided by the Forest Service.
