From I-75, exit 38, take KY 192 west for 11.9 miles. Turn south on Forest Service Road 62 for 2.4 miles.



Parking
Parking is located at the Craigs Creek Boat Ramp parking area or the Craigs Creek Group Campground. The campground is gated and closed October through April.



Open Dates
Trail is open all year.



Fees
No fee for trail use.



Accessibility
This trail does not meet accessibility standards for persons with disabilities.

Restrictions



Trail is closed to motorized vehicles.



Consumption of alcohol and open containers of alcohol are prohibited.



No swimming or fishing at boat ramp.



No horses allowed in developed recreation areas.




Craigs Creek Trail, located on London Ranger District, connects Craigs Creek Group Campground with the boat ramp. The walk is very easy and it features several views of Laurel River Lake. The lake has 5,600 acres of water surface and nearly 200 miles of tree-lined shore.

Nearby Facilities: Tucked away on the backwaters of Good's Branch on Laurel River Lake, Craigs Creek Group Campground is the only group camp on the London Ranger District. Craigs Creek Boat Ramp is located 3/4 mile from the group use area.

FOOD STORAGE REQUIRED. Visitors in developed sites must store food, garbage and other odorous items that may attract bears in a bear-resistant container, inside their vehicle, or in an enclosed hard-body trailer. Backcountry campers must suspend food, garbage and odorous items at least 10 feet off the ground and four feet away from any tree or pole. All food leftovers and trash must be properly disposed of in a bear-resistant trash receptacle or other container where provided by the Forest Service.
