Directions
From I-75, take exit 25 and travel west on US 25 W. Turn right on KY 1193 and travel several miles, merging straight ahead onto KY 1277. From KY 1277, in less than 2 miles from its intersection with 1193, turn left onto Forest Service Road 193. The Bark Camp trailhead is approximately two miles south on the right.



Parking
Parking for 3 to 4 vehicles is located at the trailhead parking area.



Open Dates
Open all year.



Fees
No fee for trail use.



Accessibility
This trail does not meet accessibility standards for persons with disabilities.



Restrictions
Trail is closed to motorized vehicles.



Consumption of alcohol and open containers of alcohol are prohibited.



Camping and firebuilding in rock shelters is prohibited.

This is a popular trail, located on London Ranger District, follows the north side of Bark Camp Creek. The trail passes under rock shelters and cliffs. There is a small waterfall about a mile from the trailhead and a beautiful series of cascades near the trail's junction with the Sheltoewe Trace National Recreation Trail. An adirondack shelter is located on the Sheltoewe Trace about one tenth mile south of its junction with Bark Camp Trail. The creek is stocked with rainbow trout.


Bark Creek and Star Creek Shelters

The Forest Service administers two adirondack shelters, Bark Camp and Star Creek shelters. Both are located on the Moonbow section of the Sheltoewe Trace. These shelters are available on a first-come, first-served basis. No restroom facilities are available. Plan on packing in your drinking water and packing out your trash.



CAUTION: Low lying areas are prone to flooding, so be alert for flooding when driving, camping or crossing streams in this area. Swift currents and undertows can make swimming and wading very hazardous.


FOOD STORAGE REQUIRED. Visitors in developed sites must store food, garbage and other odorous items that may attract bears in a bear-resistant container, inside their vehicle, or in an enclosed hard-body trailer. Backcountry campers must suspend food, garbage and odorous items at least 10 feet off the ground and four feet away from any tree or pole. All food leftovers and trash must be properly disposed of in a bear-resistant trash receptacle or other container where provided by the Forest Service.
