SHERIDAN MOUNTAIN TRAIL #11

GENERAL INFORMATION: Sheridan Mountain Trail #11 runs north-south along the western flank of Sheridan Mountain, south of the Camp Wood area. The peak was named after Tom Sheridan, an early settler living in Williamson Valley during the late 1870s. TR 11 passes through pinyon-juniper woodland and chaparral, where scrub jays, rabbits, coyotes, and other animals make their homes. Fortunate visitors may spot wildlife along the trail.

TR 11 passes through some of the most rugged and remote country in northern Arizona, offering outstanding opportunities for solitude and backcountry orienteering. The trail ends at its junction with Cedar Mesa Trail #13 and Bullwater Trail #24. TR 13 continues for another 1.8 miles to Willow Spring and FR 705A. TR 24 travels around the far side of Sheridan Mountain before it joins with FR 705A east of the peak.

CAUTION: This trail is open to hikers, horseback riders, mountain bikes, dirt bikes and ATV's. Please be considerate of others—slow down and know when to yield the trail.

ACCESS AND TRAILHEAD LOCATION: From its intersection with Hwy 89, travel west on Outer Loop Road 6 miles to Williamson Valley Road. Turn right and continue 13 miles to Camp Wood Road (also County Road 68), on the left. Take Camp Wood Road 14.6 miles to FR 705. Turn left onto FR 705 and travel 9.2 miles to the trailhead. Parking is poor.

TRAVEL TIME: 1.25 hours from Chino Valley

ROAD CONDITIONS: A high clearance vehicle is recommended.

HIKING TIME: 2 hours, one-way **LENGTH:** 3.8 miles **DIFFICULTY:** Difficult **USE:** Light

NOTES: Motorized vehicles must be less than 50" wide. There is no drinking water at the trailhead or along the trail. Trails in this area receive infrequent maintenance and may be in poor condition.

RECOMMENDED SEASONS OF USE: Spring, summer, fall, winter


