



BROWN'S PASS TRAIL #369 → 5.4 MILES ONE WAY

DIFFICULTY: Moderate to More Difficult.

SEASON OF USE: Summer through fall.

ELEVATION GAINS: Junction with Texas Creek Trail #416 is at 10,770', Brown's Pass is at 12,040', Denny Creek Trailhead is at 10,000'.

USGS MAPS: Mt. Yale

ACCESS #1: From Taylor Park, take the Texas Creek Road #755 to the end. This is a high clearance, four wheel drive road. Hike up Texas Creek Trail for 2.5 miles to the intersection with Brown's Pass Trail. From here it is 1.8 miles to the summit of Brown's Pass. The trail then continues down North Fork Creek for 3.6 miles to the trailhead on Cottonwood Pass Road.


ACCESS #2: The Denny Creek Trailhead is located on the east side of Cottonwood Pass Road. Trail #1442 leaves the trailhead and climbs to the summit of Brown's Pass in 3.6 miles. (See San Isabel National Forest, Salida Ranger District).

ATTRACTIONS: This trail accesses Collegiate Peaks Wilderness and the Continental Divide at Brown's Pass.


CONSIDERATIONS: Brown's Pass is a primitive trail that is often difficult to follow. It is a non-motorized trail located within the wilderness. Dogs must be on a leash and the maximum party size is 15 people or a combination of 25 people and stock animals. Check with the Gunnison office for additional regulations in the Collegiate Peaks Wilderness.
