



DAISY PASS TRAIL #404 → 7.3 MILES ONE WAY

DIFFICULTY: More Difficult

SEASON OF USE: Summer through fall

ELEVATION GAIN: Baxter Basin is 10,760', Daisy Pass is 11,600',
Redwell Basin is 10,740'.

USGS MAP: Oh-Be-Joyful

ACCESS: Take Highway 135 one mile north of Crested Butte; turn left onto Slate River Road #734 and travel for six miles until the townsite of Pittsburg. Turn left onto the Poverty Gulch road #734.2A and park or continue along the rough four-wheel drive road towards Baxter Basin. The trailhead is located off the extremely rough, 4 wheel-drive road 552. It is recommended to park at the Poverty Gulch intersection or at the second stream crossing.


ATTRACTIONS: The Daisy Pass trail crosses several high mountain passes and skirts some breathtaking alpine lakes. The rugged backcountry accessed by this trail is a terrific opportunity for experienced hikers to familiarize themselves with the Crested Butte area. Several scenic loops can be traveled by starting at the Daisy Pass Trailhead and ending at the Oh-Be-Joyful or Peeler Basin Trailheads.

CONSIDERATIONS: Road access to the Daisy Pass Trail requires high clearance, four-wheel drive vehicles. Most of this trail is located within the Raggeds Wilderness area and is accessible for foot and horse travel ONLY. Group size is limited to a total of 25 people/saddle animals. Please keep dogs on a leash. Please *Leave No Trace!*
