Job Vacancies: The Daniel Boone National Forest, Cumberland Ranger District, will soon be filling a temporary position. The selected applicant will serve as GS-0326-02 Office Clerk at the Gladie Center based in the Red River Gorge; however the duty station is listed as Stanton, KY in USAJOBS. GS-0326-02 salary ranges from about \$11-\$12/hour. The start date will be in April, 2015 for this position. The end date will be sometime in the fall. Actual start/end dates will be finalized when the final candidate is selected. No government housing is available; rental housing is available in the surrounding area.

The Positions: Duties for the Office clerk position primarily include providing visitor information/interpretive activities on the Cumberland Ranger District though other duties may be assigned. The position will require mostly office work and some outdoor activities. Interested applicants must possess a valid driver's license.
