

Rincon Shortcut Rules and Regulations

San Gabriel River Ranger District

Angeles National Forest and San Gabriel Mountains National Monument

Along with this permit, you are responsible for the following rules and regulations of this area. If any of these rules and regulations are violated you are subject to citation.










PERMIT

Permits must be obtained with a valid Driver's License either at the San Gabriel Canyon OHV Area, Sat-Sun, and 8 AM - 4 PM or at the Glendora District Office Mon-Friday, and 8 AM - 4 PM. Visitor Permits are free and valid for two weeks.

All vehicles entering the area must have current registration, including motorcycles, ATV's, etc. Providing the combination to any other party not listed on the permit is **PROHIBITED!**

Use of a high clearance vehicle and 4 wheel drive is highly recommended. The road conditions of the Rincon Shortcut vary greatly due to rock fall, washouts and other effects associated with weather related conditions. At any given time these conditions may change rapidly.

RULES OF THE TRAIL

-  You must have your permit in your possession at the time of your visit.
-  Riding is limited to 1/2 hour before sunrise and 1/2 hour after sunset unless your vehicle is equipped with proper lighting gear.
-  After entering a closed gate, you are REQUIRED to close and lock the gate behind you.
-  Do NOT block any gates!
-  All ATV's and motorcycles must be equipped with FS approved spark arrestors.
-  All California State laws and Fish and Wildlife rules and regulations apply!
-  All fire regulations will be enforced. NO CHARCOAL or WOOD FIRES! Only propane/gas stoves are allowed, and **MUST** have a valid campfire permit at all times.
-  All vehicles must stay on the road at all times. Any deviation from leaving the road (for example; creating a new trail, hill climbing, causing any type of resource damage, and /or driving around posted barriers) is prohibited.
-  There is NO cell site reception along the Rincon Shortcut Road.

Remember, the Angeles National Forest is neither able nor responsible to retrieve your vehicle should it become stranded or broken-down.
