

TEMPORARY CLOSURE ORDER

CONDITIONS OF USE MARK TWAIN NATIONAL FOREST

Under Authority of the Act of Congress of June 4, 1897, as amended, (16 U.S.C. 551) and pursuant to the Secretary of Agriculture's Regulations set forth at 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart B (36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b)). These restrictions are in addition to those enumerated in Code of Federal Regulations Title 36, Part 261, Subpart A, and become effective when signed and will remain in effect until rescinded.

ALL OF THE BELL MOUNTAIN WILDERNESS ON THE POTOSI/FREDERICKTOWN RANGER DISTRICT OF MARK TWAIN NATIONAL FOREST ARE CLOSED TO THE PUBLIC ON FEBRUARY 23rd THROUGH THE 24TH, 2015, FROM 8:00AM TO 5:00PM AS DESCRIBED BELOW, AND ARE NECESSARY FOR PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY (36 CFR 261.53 d & e and 36 CFR 261.54 a & e).

All NFS Lands within the legal description are temporarily closed to the public.

All Forest Service Road accessing the above NFS lands are temporarily closed to the public


Forest Service Designated Trails: Bell Mountain Trail and the FT 12 Trailhead; Lindsey Mountain Trail and Trailhead; Bell Mountain portion of the Taum Sauk Section of the Ozark Trail and the Highway A Trailhead.

Forest Service System Roads: FR 7047, FR 2775

Violations of these Prohibitions are punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual and \$10,000 for an organization or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both. [16 USC 551, 18 USC 3559 and 3571].


