Accomplishments Provided with Recreation Fees:

Recreation Rentals

- Repaired or replaced dry rot in logs at Muddy Guard Cabin with the help of HistoricCorps and Passport in Time volunteers.
- Maintained and operated Muddy Guard Cabin, which included pumping the toilet, cleaning the chimney and wood stove, providing power and cleaning supplies, checking the cabin, maintaining the landscape and providing firewood.

Special Feature

Historic cabins require a lot of tender loving care. Besides the dry-rot repair already mentioned, volunteers repaired the window sashes, replaced insect screens in windows and stained the outhouse and cabin. They also built a new firewood holder, a new railing for the front steps and a site entrance gate.

Developed Campgrounds

- Purchased materials to construct a building that will house the campground's solar water system at Hunter Campground. Without this funding, there would not be any potable water at the campground.

Outfitter and Guide Special Uses

- Administered Special Use Permits for services to the public provided by outfitters and guides and special recreation events, including hunting and fishing guided trips, horseback riding, cross country ski races, snowmobile poker runs and covered wagon tours.


