Special Feature

Shell Falls Interpretive Site is a popular stop along the Bighorn Scenic Byway. Thundering Shell Falls is the main attraction though visitors also enjoy views of 'Copman's Tomb' to the north. A short interpretive loop trail is perched on the sheer cliffs of the waterfall's canyon. Interpretive signs along the way describe the valuable resources and history of the area.


