

It is the responsibility of the user to acquire the current MVMU. This MVMU shows the National Forest System (NFS) lands that are open to public use. The National Forest System lands in the Challis-Vanhook Fork Range National District that are designated for motor vehicle use are shown on the MVMU. The MVMU also shows the vehicle classes allowed on each route and in each area and the special restrictions that apply to those routes and in those areas.

Designation of a road, trail, or area for motor vehicle use does not mean that the use is required. It should not be interpreted as encouraging or inviting use or implying that the road, trail, or area is passable, available, or suitable for use. The MVMU does not indicate whether parking along designated routes and at facilities is permitted. The MVMU does not indicate whether use is or when not permitted due to damage to National Forest System resources. Seasonal weather conditions and natural resource management activities may make some areas unsuitable for extended periods. Designated areas may contain hazardous conditions. The MVMU does not indicate that roads and trails may be passable only by high-clearance vehicles or four-wheel-drive vehicles. Maintenance of designated areas may require special equipment and personnel, and many may receive little maintenance.

This MVMU may identify those roads, trails, and areas that are open to motor vehicle use under 36 CFR 212.61 for the purpose of enforcing the prohibition at 36 CFR 212.62. The MVMU is not intended to provide the roads shown for information and navigation purposes only and are not subject to designation under the Forest Service road system.

These designations apply only to National Forest System roads, National Forest System trails, and areas

Motor vehicle use off of trails open to wheeled vehicles 50" or less and trails open to motorcycles for the purpose of dispersed camping is permitted for up to 100ft from the centerline of the trail.
