

# South Pedlar ATV Trail System

You are responsible for your own safety. Trail use has inherent risks and you may encounter a variety of unexpected and/or dangerous conditions. It is your responsibility to be informed and take precautions.

**DIRECTIONS:** Traveling west from Lynchburg, follow VA Highway 130 East. Just after crossing under the Blue Ridge Parkway, turn right onto FR 319 and continue to the Terrapin Trailhead Parking Lot. The Rattlesnake Trailhead Parking Lot is another .75 miles west on VA 130 on the right on FR 564.

If you are traveling east on VA 130, the parking lot entrances are on the left just before you cross under the Blue Ridge Parkway.

**FACILITIES:** There are 19 miles of looping trails designed specifically for ATVs. Parking is available at the Terrapin Trailhead and Rattlesnake Trailhead. Vault toilets and loading ramps are available at each trailhead.

Camping anywhere within the area is prohibited.

Cross country travel is not permitted. Stay on designated trails. Trails are marked with different colored paint blazes. See map on reverse side. Trail travel is two-way.

**FEES: Every operator of an ATV, motor bike, and bicycle on trails within the South Pedlar ATV Trail System must purchase a permit. All operators must purchase a permit and display it on their person, even if they are operating the same vehicle.**

There are three permits available.

- **Daily Permit:** \$5.00 per operator
- **3-Day Permit:** \$12.00 per operator (days must be consecutive)
- **Annual Permit:** \$30 per operator (based on calendar year)

- Permits are not transferable.

- Permits are valid only when operator's name and dates of use are written on the permit.

- Permits are not replaceable - if you lose your permit you must buy a new one.

- Area open annually April 1 to December 1.

- All operators of ATVs must purchase a permit, including hunters.

Only 4 wheel ATVs are permitted on designated trails. Vehicles must be 50" or less in width and less than 1,500 pounds unloaded weight.

According to 36 CFR 261.17, failure to purchase a permit will result in a violation notice or court appearance.

## FOLLOW AREA REGULATIONS

- All operators and riders must wear a helmet.
- No passengers on any ATVs unless factory manufactured for multiple passengers.
- Children 12-16 yrs old are permitted to operate ATVs of no more than 90cc.
- Children under 12 years are not permitted to operate ATVs or motor bikes.
- No alcohol on trails or in parking lots.
- You may not drive in a careless or reckless manner or in a manner that will endanger any person or property.
