



Experience the Outdoors with the Youth Conservation Corps

The Pemigewasset Ranger District is looking for 6 youths ages 15-18 to work, learn and earn together by doing conservation projects on the White Mountain National Forest. This program is a great way for area youth to gain valuable experience while working in the natural resources field. YCC projects include trail building, improving wildlife habitat and maintaining trailheads and parking areas, as well as provide support to other natural resource related disciplines. The program will start late June and run for eight weeks.

The program is sponsored by the Pemigewasset Ranger District of the White Mountain National Forest, headquartered in Campton NH. The randomly selected crew will consist of 6 students; 50% boys and 50% girls. Enrollees will work a 40 hour week earning minimum wage and will be involved with the following conservation activities: trail maintenance, clean-up and maintenance of recreation sites and parking areas, wildlife habitat improvement work, and other special projects supporting Timber and Fire management. The YCC crew will also spend one day a week learning about natural resource conservation and management during dedicated education days. This 8 week program will run from June 22 to August 14.
