


VERDE RIVER CORRIDOR Tapco to Beasley Flat and Highway 89A to Sedona

CAUTION:

Even though the Verde River flows through three populated communities with paved roads, bridges, police, fire departments, and hospitals, it is still a wild river. A seemingly peaceful surface can hide strong currents, boulders, and tree branches underneath. Dangerous floods can occur unexpectedly. There are several obstructions, such as gravel dams, fences, and piled up chunks of concrete and debris that can be hazardous to the canoe or swimmer. There are wild animals and venomous reptiles and insects. If you become stranded, you may be in an isolated location where there are no nearby telephones or other assistance. Plan for the unexpected. Contact local organizations and agencies for specific river conditions before attempting to canoe or kayak. Please use caution and common sense when enjoying the many splendors offered by the Verde River Corridor.
