Malheur National Forest


May 12th, 2015

Campgrounds: At this time none of the campgrounds on the forest are maintained.

- Water is on and the gate is open at the Trout Farm Campground
- Water is on and Magone Lake is reachable by passenger vehicle
- Water is on and Big Creek Campground is reachable by passenger vehicle
- Water is on and Parish Cabin Campground is reachable by passenger vehicle
- Wickiup Campground is reachable by passenger vehicle
- Dixie Campground is reachable by passenger vehicle
- Lower Camp Creek Campground is reachable by passenger vehicle
- Oregon Mine Campground is reachable by passenger vehicle
- Billy Field's Forest Campground is reachable by passenger vehicle
- Starr Campground is reachable by passenger vehicle.
- Strawberry Campground is reachable by passenger vehicle.
- Slide Creek Campground is reachable by passenger vehicle.
- Slide Horse Campground is reachable by passenger vehicle.
- Middle Fork Campground is reachable by passenger vehicle
- Deerhorn Campground is reachable by passenger vehicle
- Delintment Lake Campground is temporarily closed for hazard tree removal
- Yellow Jacket Campground is temporarily closed for hazard tree removal
- Emigrant Campground is temporarily closed for hazard tree removal
- Falls Campground is temporarily closed for hazard tree removal
- Idlewild Campground is temporarily closed for hazard tree removal
- Rock Springs Campground is temporarily closed for hazard tree removal
- Buck Springs Campground is temporarily closed for hazard tree removal
- Tip Top Campground is temporarily closed for hazard tree removal

Roads:

- This is the road information:
 - The 18 Road is open and passable to passenger vehicles.
 - Forest Road 2150 is open to Aldrich Lookout
 - County Road 65 is open to Forest Road 15
 - Forest Road 15 is open all the way through
 - Forest Road 16 is open from Seneca to the junction with Forest Road 13
 - Forest Road 13 is open from the junction with County Road 62 all the way through to the junction with Forest Road 16
 - Forest Road 1663 is open all the way through to Antelope Lookout
 - Forest Road 21 is open all the way through from the junction with US Highway 26 to the junction with County Road 62/ Izee Highway.
 - Forest Road 2170 is open all the way through

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- Forest Road 36 is open from Four Corners off of County Road 18 to County Road 20

Trails:

- Trails on the forest are becoming reachable with warmer temperatures. These trails have not been cleared or maintained for the season, visitors may find down trees, debris or snow on the trails.
- Strawberry Basin Trailhead is reachable by passenger vehicles
- Strawberry Basin Trail #375 is open to Strawberry Lake however; hikers will encounter patches of snow and downed trees on the trail.
- McClellan Mountain Trail #216 is reachable by passenger vehicles, be prepared for downed trees.
- Fields Peak Trail #212 is reachable by passenger vehicles, be prepared for downed trees.
- Sumpter Valley Interpretive Trail is reachable by passenger vehicles.
- Big Creek/Summit Prairie Trail #B5053 is reachable by passenger vehicles; however the trail may still have patches of snow and downed trees.
- Trails are not officially closed on the forest; however some may not be passable without snowshoes or skis and many are unreachable by passenger vehicle due to snow and mud.

Recreation Rentals:

- Sunshine Guard Station is open year round. Cost per night: \$60.00
- Fall Mountain Lookout is open: Cost per night: \$40.00
- Deer Creek Guard Station to Open May 15th, 2015: Cost per night: \$60.00
- Magone Covered Picnic Area to Open May 22nd, 2015: Cost \$25.00 a day
- Magone Group Campsite to Open May 22nd, 2015: Cost \$60.00
