Prohibition of Motor Vehicles on Trails in the Bear Creek Watershed

Pursuant to 16 United States Code (U.S.C.) § 551 and 36 Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.) § 261.50 (b), the following act is prohibited on specific trails, or trail segments, within the National Forest System lands in the Bear Creek watershed, Pike National Forest, El Paso and Teller Counties, Colorado (the "Restricted Trails").

The Restricted Trails are depicted on the attached map, hereby incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A.

The Restricted Trails are further defined as the following described National Forest System Trails (NFST):

- NFST 665 in its entirety
- NFST 666 in its entirety
- NFST 667 in its entirety
- NFST 668 from its junction with NFST 667 to its junction with NFST 720
- NFST 701 from its junction with NFST 667 to its junction with NFST 720
- NFST 720A from its junction with NFST 667 to its junction with NFST 720

This Order is issued according to the terms of a Stipulated Settlement Agreement entered in United States District Court for the District of Colorado.

PROHIBITION:

- 1. Using any motor vehicle on a Restricted Trail. 36 C.F.R. § 261.55 (b).

EXEMPTIONS:


Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

- 1. Any federal, state or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force, in the performance of an official duty;
- 2. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.

This Order shall be in effect from June 20, 2015 until June 20, 2016, or until rescinded, whichever event occurs first.

This Order supersedes, rescinds, and replaces Order # PSICC-2014-10, issued June 19, 2014.

Violations of these prohibitions are punishable as a Class B misdemeanor by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for a legal entity other than an individual, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. (16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C. §§ 3559 and 3571).
