

FOREST ORDER

**USDA FOREST SERVICE
PIKE and SAN ISABEL NATIONAL FORESTS**

**Occupancy and Use Restrictions
Food Storage Regulation**

Pursuant to 16 USC § 551, and 36 CFR § 261.50(a), the following act is prohibited on the National Forest System lands within the Pike and San Isabel National Forests as described below and hereinafter referred to as the Restricted Area. The Restricted Area is located in the state of Colorado and is depicted on the attached maps, hereby incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A. The Restricted Area also includes all Developed Recreation Sites, and all recreation sites occupied under Special-Use Permit, as described in the attached definitions, hereby incorporated into this Order as Exhibit B.

The purpose of this Order is to protect public safety by minimizing adverse interactions between bears and humans.

PROHIBITION:

- Possessing or leaving unattended any food, refuse or other bear attractants as defined in Exhibit B, unless it is stored in a bear-resistant manner; is being eaten, or prepared for eating; or is being transported.
36 CFR § 261.58(cc)

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a USDA Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any federal, state, or local officer or member of an organized rescue group or fire fighting force, in the performance of an official duty.

This order supersedes, rescinds, and replaces Order 10-10, issued June 26, 2010

This Order shall remain in effect for one (1) year from the date signed, or until rescinded, whichever event occurs first.

Areas Affected by the Order

In addition to the developed recreation sites listed, this order applies to the following areas:

Leadville District – Halfmoon

1. National Forest System Road (NFSR) 110 from the Forest boundary west to the intersection with NFSR 110.J, from the Wilderness boundary on the north to ¼ mile south of the road.



South Platte Ranger District - Buffalo

3. NFSR 550, from its junction with Jefferson County Road 126, about 5 miles west to the junction with NFSR 543, ¼ mile either side of the road.



Guanella Pass

4. Park County Road 62, from the Forest Boundary near U.S. Highway 285, north to the Forest boundary, ¼ mile either side of the road. NFSR 119, from the intersection with Park CR 62, to its terminus, ¼ mile either side of the road.



San Carlos Ranger District – South Colony

5. NFSR 120 from the creek crossing at South Colony Creek, south west to the road terminus and to the Wilderness boundary on either side of the road.



Salida Ranger District – Chalk Creek

6. All National Forest System Lands in within ¼ mile either side of County Road 162 from the Forest boundary to the town of St. Elmo.



Salida Ranger District – Collegiate Peaks

- 7. All National Forest System Lands along County Road 306 in Range 80 West, Township 14 South, south of the Wilderness boundary, and all lands in Section 27.



Salida Ranger District – Hayden Creek

- 8. All National Forest System Lands in Range within ¼ mile either side of FDR 006 from the Forest boundary westward to the Sangre De Cristo Wilderness Boundary.



9. All National Forest System Lands in Range 7 East, Township 48 North, Section 12.



Salida Ranger District – South Cottonwood

10. All National Forest System Lands within ¼ mile either side of County Road 344 from the intersection with County Road 306 westward to ½ mile past Cottonwood Campground.
