SLIDING ROCK RULES AND REGULATIONS

As a visitor to the National Forest, you must follow certain rules to protect the forest and to ensure your health and safety. Lifeguards and Collection officers will be on site to enforce the following rules for your safety.

1. You must know how to swim (the pool is approximately 8 feet deep).
2. Children under 7 years of age must slide with an adult (one adult per child and child must be able to swim).
3. Everyone must slide in a seated position only.
4. Coast Guard approved life jackets are the only floatation devices allowed.
5. Pets must be on a leash, and are not allowed on the rock, or in the swimming area.
6. Organized group limit is 50 people per day. Groups of any type, including organizational/summer camps, must sign in with the site manager **BEFORE** sliding. Best time for large groups is before 11am or after 4pm; otherwise, the area may be too full to accommodate your group.
7. All visiting groups must adequately supervise and maintain control of their group members at ALL TIMES.
8. Picnicking, glass containers, and alcoholic beverages are **PROHIBITED** at Sliding Rock: this rule applies to the parking area as well.
9. Fishing is prohibited in the pool at the base of Sliding Rock.
10. **SLIDING ROCK WILL BE CLOSED WHEN LIFEGUARDS DETERMINE IT UNSAFE TO SLIDE** (ex.: water level too high, thunder, and/or lightning).
11. When the parking lot is full: the site manager will allow a certain number of vehicles to enter the area in order to wait in line for a parking spot. Once the waiting line is full, the site manager will close the entrance until enough parking spots are available for the Recreation Area to safely re-open.
12. Report all serious injuries to lifeguards or site managers at entrance of Recreation Area.
13. Watercraft (kayaks, rafts, tubes, etc.) are not allowed on Sliding Rock, or in the swimming area.
