RESOLUTION 2015-1

A RESOLUTION IDENTIFYING THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR FIRE DEPARTMENT RESPONSE TO INCIDENTS OUTSIDE OF THE JURISDICTION WHEN THE LAKE VALLEY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT IS COMPENSATED OR REIMBURSED FOR SUCH RESPONSE

Whereas, the Lake Valley Fire Protection District routinely responds to requests for assistance to incidents outside the jurisdiction; and

Whereas, the request for resources to respond for assistance may be through an "Assistance for Hire" arrangement; and

Whereas, the Lake Valley Fire Protection District may be compensated for resources provided or reimbursed for response expenses through such agreements; and

Whereas, Fire District personnel will be compensated (for all time committed to/portal to portal) by the Lake Valley Fire Protection District for response through such agreement,

Now, Therefore, Be It Hereby resolved by the Board of Directors of the Lake Valley Fire Protection District that:

- 1. When the Lake Valley Fire Protection District receives compensation and/or reimbursement for incident/event response through an agreement, such compensation and/or reimbursement will be used for personnel compensation, equipment use, repair, and replacement, and allowable administrative costs as authorized by the agreement.
- Personnel shall be compensated according to Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), Personnel Rules and Regulations, fire district Policies and Procedures and/or other directive that identifies personnel compensation in the workplace.
- In the event a personnel classification does not have an assigned compensation rate, a "Base Rate" as set forth in an organizational policy, administrative directive or similar document will to compensate such personnel.
- 4. The Lake Valley Fire Protection District will maintain a <u>current</u> salary survey on file with the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services, Fire Rescue Division.
- 5. Personnel will be compensated (portal to portal) beginning at the time of dispatch to the return to jurisdiction when equipment and personnel are in service and available for agency response.
