NATIONAL FOREST OCCUPANCY AND USE REGULATIONS

Entry Restriction – Santiago Mill Site

Pursuant to 16 United States Code (U.S.C.) § 551 and 36 Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.) § 261.50(a), the following acts are prohibited on National Forest System lands within the Clear Creek Ranger District of the Arapaho National Forest that are located in Clear Creek County (the “Restricted Areas”).

The Restricted Area known as the Santiago Mill includes any structures or improvements associated with the Santiago Mill site, including, but not limited to the mill building, bunkhouse, trestle, ore bin, water tank and any other accessory structures. The Restricted Area is located at the junction of the buck and pole fence and National Forest System Road #248.2D and surrounds the Santiago Mill Site at T5S, R75W, Section 3, 6th P.M. as depicted on the attached map, hereby incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A.

The purpose of this Order is to provide for public safety during the containment and capping process of the heavily contaminated soils as well as property and resource protection.

PROHIBITIONS:

1. Going into or being upon the restricted area. 36 CFR § 261.53 (e) and (f).

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this ORDER:

1. Person with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

This ORDER will be in effect when signed and will remain in effect until rescinded.

Violations of these prohibitions are punishable as a Class B misdemeanor by a fine of not more than \$5000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. (16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C §§ 3559 and 3571).
