

ORDER NO. 15-05-770
KLAMATH NATIONAL FOREST
EMERGENCY CLOSURE

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), and to provide for public safety, the following acts are prohibited within the Happy Camp Ranger District of the Klamath National Forest. This Order is effective from August 21, 2015 until the Gasquet Complex Bear Fire is fully suppressed.

1. Going into or being upon National Forest System lands within the boundary of Gasquet Complex Bear Fire Closure Area circumscribed as follows: beginning at Youngs Peak at the Klamath and Six Rivers National Forests boundary; then continuing southerly along the Forest boundary to its intersection with a tributary of Clear Creek at Section 18, of Township 16 North and Range 5 East, Mt. Diablo Base and Meridian; then continuing southeast along the Clear Creek tributary to its intersection with the Clear Creek National Recreation Trail (Forest Trail No.5223); then continues northerly along the eastern edge of Clear Creek National Recreation Trail (Forest Trail No.5223) to its intersection with the Forest boundary, then continuing west along the Forest Boundary back to the starting point, as shown on the map. 36 CFR 261.53(e).
2. Being on any National Forest System trail within the Gasquet Complex Bear Fire Closure Area, as shown on the attached map. 36 CFR 261.55(a).


Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571 and 3581.
