Forest Order

Occupancy and Use on National Forest System Lands

Road Closure

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(b), the following act(s) below are prohibited in the area displayed on the attached map within the Priest Lake Ranger District of the Idaho Panhandle National Forests.

Being on or using the following roads:

Road # 310 at the Jct. with road # 219. T60N R5W Sec 19 BM
Road # 2292 at Jct. with road # 1308. T59N R5W Sec 8 BM
Road # 1094 at Jct. with road # 312. T59N R5W Sec 7 BM
Road # 312 at Jct. with road # 659. T34N R45E Sec 1 WM
Road # 333B West of the private. T59N R5W Sec 20 BM
Road # 2730 South of the private. T34N R45E Sec 19 WM
Road # 1098 at the Jct. with road 2250. T59N R5W Sec 32 BM
Road # 1095 at the Jct. with road # 2250. T58N R5W Sec 7 WM
Road # 1095 Northeast of the private. T32N R45E Sec 12 WM
Road # 462 North of the private. T32N R45E Sec 12 WM
Road # 1084 North of the private. T32N R45E Sec 14 WM
Road # 305 West of the private. T32N R45E Sec 12 WM

When provided in an order, 36 CFR 261.53 (e) and 36 CFR 261.54 (e), it is prohibited to go into or be upon any area (road) which is closed for the protection of public health or safety.

This closure is necessary for public safety due to wildfire activity that has recently occurred. This closure becomes effective on Tuesday, August 18, 2015 and will remain in effect until rescinded or revoked.

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e) the following individuals are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or Local Law Enforcement Officer or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

Violations of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both (16 U.S.C. 551 and 18 U.S.C. 3559 and 3571).
