Frog Pond Fire held at 15 acres

JOHN DAY, Ore. – The **Frog Pond Fire** was successfully kept at 15 acres. Reported Sunday evening, it is now 100 percent dozer lined. Crews will continue to work and mop-up the fire today.

The fire is located 13 miles northeast of Prairie City, about three and a half miles south of Greenhorn.

The fire danger rating across the Malheur National Forest is currently at EXTREME/VERY HIGH. Industrial Fire Precaution Level IV and Phase C of Public Use Restrictions are in effect forest-wide. This means, campfires are not allowed, no internal combustion engine operation, except for motor vehicles, smoking is allowed only in enclosed vehicles and buildings, developed recreation sites, or cleared areas, and no off-road/off-trail vehicle travel or travel on roads not cleared of standing grass or other flammable material.
