Forest Order No. 01-04-01-15-008

National Forest System Area Closure

Pursuant to Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations, Chapter II, Part 261, Subpart B, Section 261.50(b), the following act is prohibited on the Coeur d'Alene River Ranger District within the Idaho Panhandle National Forests:

Being on or using the following area (National Forest System lands) within the Coeur d'Alene River Ranger District Fire Closure is prohibited. Being in the Coeur d'Alene River Ranger District Fire Closure area is defined by National Forest System lands located within the following boundaries (36 CFR 261.52(e)):

All National Forest System lands, trails and roads within the Coeur d'Alene River Ranger District north of Interstate 90.

Excepting and excluding English Point, Mokins Bay Campground and Forest Service Road # 332 (Bunco Road) from T. 53 N., R 2 W., section 28 to its junction with Forest Service Road # 278.

Excepting and excluding all non-National Forest lands and roads (i.e. private lands, county roads and other non-National Forest lands and roads).

Being on the following Forest Roads (36 CFR 261.54(e)):

All Forest Service roads within the closure area are closed with the exception of Forest Service Road # 332 (Bunco Road) from T. 53 N., R 2 W., section 28 to its junction with Forest Service Road # 278.

Forest Service Road # 1066 is closed by this order from its junction with Forest Service Road # 332 at Johnson Saddle north to its junction with Forest Service Road # 278 on the Sandpoint Ranger District.

Being on Forest Trails (36 CFR 261.55(a)):

All Forest Service trails within the closure area are closed.

Being in developed recreation sites (36 CFR 261.58(b)):

All Forest Service recreation sites in the closure area are closed with the exception of English Point and Mokins Bay Campground.

This restriction is in addition to those stated in Subpart A, 36 Code of Federal Regulations Part 261 and becomes effective August 19, 2015 and will remain in effect until rescinded or revoked.

This restriction is necessary for the protection of public health and safety during (36 CFR 261.53(e)) Wildfire Activity.

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following individuals are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer or member of any organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
