During intermittent absences of the Forest Supervisor, the incumbents listed below are hereby delegated the authority and responsibility of Acting Forest Supervisor for the specified durations beginning July 20, 2015 to the end of the current physical year, September 30, 2015.

The Acting Forest Supervisor shall exercise the full authority of the Forest Supervisor in accordance with Forest Service Manual Chapter 1230, including 1231.2, 1231.3, and 12316.41 with the following exceptions.

Authority is not delegated to conduct the following:

1. Approval of requests for Personnel Actions (Standard Form 52) for permanent or career seasonal employees or positions unless previously discussed and agreed upon by the Forest Supervisor. Approval of adverse personnel actions unless immediate action is required.



2. Sign or accept National Environmental Policy Act documents such as Notice of Intent, Record of Decision, Finding of No Significant Impact, or other NEPA-related matters such as supplements or appeals, unless previously discussed and agreed upon by the Forest Supervisor.
3. Approval of long-term permits or contracts. The acting Forest Supervisor is delegated authority to approve permits, grants, agreements, and NEPA decisions that are temporary in nature and do not exceed one year.
4. Establish long-term Forest policies; reverse previously set Forest policies unless action is needed to prevent loss of life or property.

This memorandum serves as delegation for an Acting Forest Supervisor to sign emergency Forest Orders. Forest Orders will be prepared for your signature with the assistance of Law Enforcement and Investigations, and the Office of the General Council. Coordination of Forest Order preparation will generally be coordinated through the Forest Supervisor's Assistant.

The authority delegated in this memorandum cannot be re-delegated. If an individual scheduled to be Acting Forest Supervisor is not available to perform those duties, the person assigned to be Acting Forest Supervisor during the following month shall assume the duties. If all the individuals scheduled to be Acting Forest Supervisor are unavailable to perform those duties, the Forest Supervisor may call on other staff to perform the duties of Acting Forest Supervisor.

The designated Acting Forest Supervisor will keep the Forest Supervisor's Assistant informed about his or her schedule and availability. Documents for the Acting Forest Supervisor's signature or approval will be sent to the Forest Supervisor's Assistant for review, processing and finalization. All documents will have the Forest Supervisor's signature block and the Acting will sign "for" the Forest Supervisor.

The Acting Forest Supervisor will work with the Forest Supervisor's Assistant to prepare and schedule a briefing for the Forest Supervisor on their return. The briefing will include a review of all actions taken, decisions made, and correspondence processed by the Acting Forest Supervisor, and a discussion of significant events, or policy developments that transpired during the Forest Supervisor's absence.

Acting Forest Supervisor assignments may be updated as changes in staffing and availability of the individuals to perform the assigned duties change throughout the year. Any changes to the acting assignments will be done so through the issuance of a new memorandum.
