4. Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire, except in designated campgrounds and designated dispersed campsites. 36 CFR 261.52 (a)
 5. Camping except in designated campgrounds and designated dispersed campsites. 36 CFR 261.58 (e)
 6. Discharging a firearm, air rifle or gas gun except persons legally hunting turkeys, waterfowl, small game or big game animals and persons discharging paintball guns. 36 CFR 261.58 (m)

36 CFR 261.10(d) Prohibits the discharging of firearms or any other implement capable of taking human life, causing serious injury or damaging property as follows: (1) In or within 150 yards of any residence, building, campsite, or occupied area, or (2) Across or on a road or body of water adjacent thereto, or in any manner or place whereby any person or property is exposed to injury or damage as a result in such discharge.
